School Council - KS2 Tuck Shop News



Last year the School Council spent a great deal of time investigating the possibility of setting up a tuck shop for the children in the juniors. They felt that as the infants had free fruit and vegetables from the government, the school should put in place something for the juniors. They were also concerned about the amount of crisps and sweet-like foods that the older children were eating at break time and felt that the children might be developing bad eating habits.

The new School Council members agreed with the outgoing council and decided to continue the project and they are pleased to launch the junior tuck shop this half-term.

Each morning before school in the junior playground the older school councillors supported by Year 6 mentors are selling fresh fruit and vegetables to the children in KS2. The fruit and veg is priced at 40p a piece and we will ensure that over the weeks there is a variety of seasonal produce. The children need to buy their tuck before school and then when the bell rings, they take it to class where it can be stored in a safe place until break time.

The school council have also decided that it is time Danbury Park School fully embraced healthy eating habits and so from Mondays through to Thursdays the children are only allowed to bring in a fruit or vegetable snack. On Fridays the rules are relaxed and the children in KS2 are allowed to bring in a savoury crisp like snack (NB no nut products, Doritos or Wotsits because of allergies) or a cake or a biscuit to enjoy, although no sweets and no bars of chocolate.

Please note that the children in the infants continue to receive their free fruit each day and so do not need to bring in any money or tuck from home at all.
