Spring Term 2018

As you will have seen from last week's newsletter, there are lots of activities and events happening this term and we will be adding to the list as the weeks go by. In a few weeks' time we have the DPSA Spring Term discos. These are always well attended and the children really enjoy the chance to meet together for a fun time. In the Spring Term the EYFS children, who are now very familiar with the school, are welcome to join us. We are sorry but parents are not allowed to stay unless they are helping run the event.

Today the children in Years 1 to 6 should be bringing home their individual progress and target reports so that you have a brief summary of how well they are doing in English and Maths and their targets for the new term. In February just before half-term we have parent consultation meetings and the teachers will be able to provide an update. We regret that if families are on holiday during this week, teachers will not be able to provide alternative dates and times during the preceding weeks. They may have some limited availability when we come back to school after the half-term break and you should contact the class teachers then.

After half-term we have our Book Week and we will let you know more details about specific events nearer the time but these will include the traditional dressing up day and a poetry writing competition! We are looking forward to Brian Moses's visit and already some of the children have been watching him perform some of his poems via the internet.

The School Council is in the process of organising film nights and we also plan to hold a special sponsored sporting activity to raise money for our Class Dove and ICT Suite remodelling project and for Sport Relief.

So a very busy and exciting term ahead.

Class Question Time

In every class on Wednesday afternoons we take some time to look at things in more detail and to explore some deep issues. In the Autumn term we all studied the same famous painting generating our own questions including ones about what we could see, what we couldn't see but thought might be happening, and then about more abstract notions. We all enjoyed investigating the *Mona Lisa* wondering if she was smiling and what about, and even contemplating the nature of beauty. This linked with our whole school and key stage assemblies about happiness and trying to understand more about our school motto: *Be wise, be happy, belong!*

Just before the Christmas break each class took a different visual stimulus and the children posed questions and explored different ideas which then led into each child producing a piece of writing. We wanted to link our question session to our shared priority of improving writing. The displays around the school reflect a small part of the work the classes have undertaken and they are most impressive.



We hope that when you visit the school you will spend some time reading our work and thinking about the questions we pose.

Star Wars Design a Poster Competition

On **Thursday the 18th January** we are having a special Star Wars themed lunch to encourage the children to try our school meals. This is a great opportunity for the children to try something different and to have some fun at meal times.

The school council would like to run a colouring competition which is open to all year groups. They would like the children to draw picture of their favourite character or scene from the Star Wars movies. All designs must be into the school office by the end of the school day on **Wednesday 17th January** where the kitchen staff will choose a winner from each class and the winners will be awarded house points. The pictures will be displayed in the school hall and the winners will be notified by the school council.

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Safeguarding - Keeping Safe

There has been a lot in the news this week about children struggling to cope with all the pressures of living in a digital age particularly when they move to secondary school. We are aware that this starts much earlier in Year 6 and even Year 5 usually when the children get their first mobile phones. As part of our PSHE programme we undertake work explaining about social media and how the children can keep themselves safe. We also include work on friendships and how saying something in a text or via a digital message should be viewed in the same way as saying something to each other in person.

Please take some time to read the report and sit down with your child and review how they can keep themselves safe and use how they can use these ways of communicating responsibly.

Notices and Reminders

Parking – Last term there were issues again with the safe and considerate use of the Danbury Outdoors carpark and Well Lane. We were informed of a parent who had parked on the yellow zig-zag lines causing an obstruction for vehicles and a danger to pedestrians.
