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I hope that you all had a good Christmas and that the New Year has started well. The Spring Term always gets underway very quickly as it is such a short term overall and we have so many exciting events and activities to fit in.

School Bungalow

Over the Christmas holiday the builders completed the renovation work on the school bungalow and we are really pleased that it is now ready for us to start moving into and using.

The bungalow will give us additional space for activities and lessons where we need more room and where the school hall is already in use. We are planning to use it for drama activities, for design and technology and for small group teaching. We have removed the old bathroom and installed three toilet cubicles including a disabled one and there is now a kitchen servery area for refreshments.

As well as using the bungalow during lesson time, it will also be used for staff training and this month our team of midday assistants will be the first to use it for their first aid training. Eagles, Little Owls' before and after school childcare club, will be moving in as soon as they can once their formalities with Ofsted have been completed.

Once we have moved in, we will hold an open afternoon for parents to see the new facilities.



Safeguarding - Keeping Safe

There has been a lot in the news this week about children struggling to cope with all the pressures of living in a digital age particularly when they move to secondary school. We are aware that this starts much earlier in Year 6 and even Year 5 usually when the children get their first mobile phones. As part of our PSHE programme we undertake work explaining about social media and how the children can keep themselves safe. We also include work on friendships and how saying something in a text or via a digital message should be viewed in the same way as saying something to each other in person.

Please take some time to read the report and sit down with your child and review how they can keep themselves safe and use how they can use these ways of communicating responsibly.

Emergency School Closures – SNOW!

As we approach the time of year when inclement weather and snow is more likely, we would like to advise you of the school's emergency closure procedure. The decision to close the school is never taken lightly but there may be rare times when the site is unsafe or insufficient staff can get into the school and closure is unavoidable.

We will also put a message out on Parentmail. We aim to do this by 7.30am.

If the weather and traffic are bad, please take care and get to school safely. We will understand if you delay your journey and arrive later than the usual time.

If you have not yet joined *Parentmail*, please ask at the office.

Notices and Reminders

Parking – Last term there were issues again with the safe and considerate use of the Danbury Outdoors carpark and Well Lane. We were informed of a parent who had parked on the yellow zig-zag lines causing an obstruction for vehicles and a danger to pedestrians.

Please think about the safety of our children before there is an incident where someone is seriously hurt.

School office opening hours – The school office opens to parents and pupils at 8.30am and closes at 3.45pm. We are sorry but after this time the office are unable to take payments and the shutters will be closed.

Adults coming into school - A gentle reminder that parent's wishing to come into the school must come to the main office sign in and be given a visitors badge regardless of their reason to enter the building. This is part of our safeguarding policy in keeping our children safe.

PE Kits – Please remember that earrings have to be removed for all PE lessons and we are not allowed to cover pupils' ears with tape.

Coats – We are now beginning to feel the chill of the encroaching winter, so it is vital that all children bring a coat into school every day. The children need fresh air, so even if it is drizzling or cold, they need to get outside at break and lunchtimes but can only do so if they have a warm, waterproof coat.
