Children from China come to Danbury

On Monday 5th of February 2018, 17 children from Beijing, China came to our school to see how different English schools are to Chinese schools. When they first arrived in the school they had a tour led by Mrs Gooding; they placed all their belongings in Class Cuckoo as Class C were on a trip.

Monday-

Once they were settled in, the whole school met in the hall to watch a traditional Chinese tea ceremony — they also let a few of the teachers try the tea. After the assembly, some pupils from Classes A and B were paired with a child from China so they could have help with work and so they had someone to play with. Violet's buddy was Sophie and Maite's buddy was Mandy. Later that day we made a clay model, the children from Danbury made a dragon and the children from China made our school logo, the owl, this took up most of the morning as we all wanted to make models look fantastic. After lunch we did maths; but it was more fun than usual. We had to round all the populations of: China, Beijing, Great Britain, Chelmsford and Danbury, the population of China was around 40 times bigger then the UK. At the end of the day our buddies walked into the hall ready to spend the night at Danbury outdoors.

Tuesday-

When the bell rang, we went into Class A and did our Morning calculations and lined up to go into the hall for assembly. Once assembly was over, we watched a video on how to make scotch pancakes (also known as drop scones) we made the batter and after break we cooked and tried them with jam and cream. We also wrote instructions on how to make the scones. After lunch, we made pie charts on the pupils' favourite toppings the most popular topping was jam and cream. Sadly the day was over but everyone was excited for Wednesday.

As soon as we got into Class A, we planned an experiment about dunking biscuits in tea and which is the best to dunk. Each group had to find a different way to see which biscuit was the best. After break time had ended we painted Chinese style pictures; taught by Mandy. Mandy was incredible at art and it was so detailed that it took us around an hour so when we finished it was lunch time. Once the hour had ticked by, we had to do Number manipulation and when it was over we had P.E with our buddies it was such fun to play hockey with them. Straight after P.E we had a special assembly to say goodbye to our buddy. It was very upsetting but they all managed to keep a straight face! We exchanged gifts and waved bye to our buddies as they walked off to Danbury outdoors.

MONDAY

On the last week before the spring half term holidays, children from Beijing arrived to visit our school. They were each assigned to a Class Avocet or Class Budgerigar student. Unfortunately, there were only enough of them to pair up with only 17 of our eager students.

They started our week by presenting a tea ceremony in front of the school. Shortly after that, each student from Beijing presented gifts for the school. We had a broad range of presents, ranging from face-changing masks to elaborate paintings and paper cuttings.

Straight after a short break, we settled down in our classes to start listening about how to use clay. Willie, had excellent English and he helped to translate what Mrs Ireland was saying! Danbury Park had to create a dragon, but on the other hand, the students from Beijing He Ping Li had to design an owl.

After that, we had lunch. The Chinese students did not seem to know where they had to go! Again, Ben had to translate all of the foods to his buddy!

Then, we had a session of mathematics – rounding which was a bit of a mystery for the Chinese students. However we were all impressed by the willingness of the Beijing students.



The next day, when we entered the classroom, we peeked at the whiteboard to notice that we were making Scottish Pancakes. There was an immediate upheaval of jubilation, whereas the Chinese students were gazing at as in uttermost confusion!

We immediately jumped into measuring ingredients and preparing the batter to fry. We had to wait for our turn, so unfortunately, that meant work. We had to write about how to make a pancake. Finally, we all had a chance to fry our own pancake and then we got to eat them plain, with jam, with cream or both! We all thought they were extremely tasty.

We then had to do the maths. We created a Carroll diagram and a pie chart to record our favourite toppings. We had to explain how to use a compass!



After a long lunch, we wrote up about an experiment about dunking biscuits. Our test subjects were rich tea biscuits, digestives, hobnobs and ginger nuts. We were to test this out tomorrow.



On Wednesday, to start the day off with excitement, we had to dance to a Scottish song called The Dashing White Sergeant, which included many different moves. Without realising, we had to dance to another Scottish song called The Flying Scotsman. The Flying Scotsman is actually a famous Scottish train!

After that, we experimented on dunking biscuits. Every student in the class was extremely excited! The first thing we did on Thursday (the last day), we painted a picture by copying from one of the Chinese pupils (Mandy). We painted a beautiful pink flower with a spiky stem and a fluffy, silky little chick. After that, we did 4 calculations.

As quick as a flash, lunch came by. The Chinese pupils were very upset about their last lunch with us; we were too. After a refreshing, delicious meal we had our last game of football outside before going back into class. During lesson time, we did an exciting math lesson where we had to describe the shape that you chose to your team mates. In Joe's opinion it was very exciting.



Unfortunately it was the last lesson of the day: PE. Joe's partner loves PE. It was also the last PE lesson on Hockey we all felt distraught. In Hockey we practised and worked hard with our buddies. Without notice it was time to say goodbye to our partners in the assembly, whilst returning the favour, giving them presents.

We all enjoyed the last week of term very much; we were all very excited because of having no hard work! In Joe's opinion, he enjoyed frying and creating pancakes as, "it was incredible." Ben's partner liked the science and the clay because, "I like creating things and experimenting." Overall it was an exciting week.

Safeguarding - Keeping Safe

Absences from School

It is so important that you let school know if your children will not be coming into school for whatever reason.

Our procedures are that the teachers take the registers promptly first thing in the morning and again straight after lunch and these are then checked by the office staff to establish which children are not in school and why. We have a designated option to report pupil absence on our telephone system so that you can leave messages at any time. Please do not contact us by e-mail as we receive so many in one day and your message may get lost. In the mornings we aim to complete these tasks by 9.30am and at that point, if we do not know why a child is not in school, we start phoning the contacts on the list supplied by you when the children joined Danbury Park School. We always start with our Year 6 and Year 5 children as they are the ones, who with your permission, may be walking to school and therefore at greater risk.

If you have applied for a leave of absence, this will be recorded in the registers and you do not need to remind us. If your child has been sent home from school unwell or you have notified us that your child is unwell, you do not need to contact us every day that they are absent. However, if we have not heard from you for two days and the illness is not one, for which we would expect your child to be away from school for a prolonged period, or we are in anyway concerned, we will phone to check. We do need a letter when your child returns to school confirming why they were absent.

Please note that should we not be able to make contact with you and we are concerned for the safety of the children, we would contact the police.
