Weather for Ducks

This week has seen some dreadful rain and I am sure you will have noticed the large puddles on the playgrounds and the school field. We were even viewed by ducks as a potential new home!



As many of you will know the drainage on the school site has been a huge problem for many years. The good news is that last year Essex County Council finally acknowledged that because the rain water was taking so long to drain away, it was having an adverse effect on the children's ability to get active at playtimes and was curtailing outside PE lessons. The council have been investigating the situation and have a plan to install underground reservoirs to prevent water building up on the surface; the water will then be pumped into nearby ditches. This plan has also had to involve the Environment Agency so has taken a long time. Whilst ECC are paying for most of the work, school is required to contribute some £10 000 towards the project which is a considerable sum for a school this size. However, thanks to the support of the DPSA who have given school a donation to cover this additional expenditure, there will be no negative impact on our provision in this respect.

A lot of preparatory work has already been undertaken during school holidays and we are hoping that the final larger scale and heavy work will be completed during the summer break ready for the new academic year.

Summer Term Reminders

Please remember that the weather is still very changeable so watch the forecasts. On chillier and drizzly days, the children will need their coats as we still go outside at break and lunch times for fresh air. On clearer days please apply a long lasting sunscreen first thing in the morning and send in a hat.

Please could you ensure that all of your child's clothing is clearly named as it makes returning jumpers and cardigans to the right child much easier. We have a large pile of lost property at the front of the school including a new coat. On fine days we will put them out on a table at the front so please come and have a look. Anything not named or claimed by 11th May will be given to charity or sent for recycling.

The children also need a water bottle in school every day. We are endeavouring to repair or replace the broken water fountains so it is really important that the children have their own water bottle in school. These can be filled up during the school day from taps within the school.

We are looking to launch the Daily Mile at Danbury Park School to get the children more involved in physical activities at lunchtime so are looking for two enthusiastic adults to lead the way.

The Daily Mile is a popular initiative in many schools now and involves the children trying to walk a mile around the school grounds each day. With the arrival of drier weather, we want to get the project to involve the children in walking as well as participating in more physical games and activities under way so that the good habits will continue into the Autumn and then throughout the following academic year.

We are really pleased that Mrs Yvonne Burton has accepted the challenge to become one of our Get Active Promoters and we are looking for someone to work alongside her to run and organise these activities. The project will initially run round to the end of Summer 2019 as it is linked directly to, and is dependent on, the Sports Grant that is given to schools and has now been confirmed for the academic year 2018-19. Although being part of the lunchtime team, our Get Active Promoters are only expected to organise and supervise the physical activities.

Notices and Reminders

Parking – Please think about the safety of our children and park with care and consideration before there is an incident where someone is seriously hurt.

Staying Safe – Members of our community have expressed their concerns about the safety of children at the end of the school day where the children are being allowed to climb trees on the grassed area by the path down from Well Lane. The branches on these trees may not be strong enough to support even a child's weight and we are concerned that children may fall and injure themselves. Similarly, we would ask that parents prevent their children climbing on the wooden gates and on the brick wall at the entrance to the school and from going behind the PE sheds by the playground.


