# TIME TABLE ROCK TARY

Before Christmas the children in Years 2, 3, 4, 5 and 6 should have brought home a letter all about TT Rockstars. This is an online resource, similar to Mathletics, to which the school has recently purchased a subscription. It is specially designed to help children learn and practise their multiplication tables in a fun and interactive way. The government will be introducing an online Multiplication test for pupils in Year 4 so we want to ensure that the children have every opportunity to learn their tables thoroughly.

We will be using the resource in school and we hope that you will make some time to explore the website with your child.

#### **Emergency School Closures - SNOW!**

As we approach the time of year when inclement weather and snow is more likely, we would like to advise you of the school's emergency closure procedure. The decision to close the school is never taken lightly but there may be rare times when the site is unsafe or insufficient staff can get into the school and closure is unavoidable.

### Safeguarding Keeping Safe

At the beginning of each term we remind the children about using the internet safely, so now is a good time for you to sit down with your child and reinforce the messages about online safety.

There has been a lot in the news recently about children struggling to cope with all the pressures of living in a digital age particularly when they move to secondary school. We are aware that this starts much earlier in Year 6 and even Year 5 usually when the children get their first mobile phones. As part of our PSHE programme we undertake work explaining about social media and how the children can keep themselves safe. We also include work on friendships and how saying something in a text or via a digital message should be viewed in the same way as saying something to each other in person.
