Children's Health and Well-being

This year Danbury Park School will be taking part in a survey on behalf of Essex County Council to gather information on the well-being of children in Essex. Last year over 18 000 pupils took part and the results help the Council and us as a school improve our provision and services. The children in Years 4, 5 and 6 are invited to take part and a letter with all the details is being sent home to parents.

The survey is an online series of questions with multiple-choice answers and we will talk the children through the process. They will be asked their opinions about healthy life=styles, emotional health, bullying and safety, children's rights and recreational activities. Responses are anonymised but in the past Danbury Park has used the information to support groups with friendship problems and to provide well-being mentor sessions.

Emergency School Closures – SNOW!

As we approach the time of year when inclement weather and snow is more likely, we would like to advise you of the school's emergency closure procedure. The decision to close the school is never taken lightly but there may be rare times when the site is unsafe or insufficient staff can get into the school and closure is unavoidable.

We will also put a message out on Parentmail. We aim to do this by 7.30am. Please let the office know if you are not receiving Parentmail messages.

If the weather and traffic are bad, please take care and get to school safely. We will understand if you delay your journey and arrive later than the usual time.

If you have not yet joined *Parentmail*, please ask at the office.

Safeguarding Keeping Safe

At the beginning of each term we remind the children about using the internet safely, so now is a good time for you to sit down with your child and reinforce the messages about online safety.

There has been a lot in the news recently about children struggling to cope with all the pressures of living in a digital age particularly when they move to secondary school. We are aware that this starts much earlier in Year 6 and even Year 5 usually when the children get their first mobile phones. As part of our PSHE programme we undertake work explaining about social media and how the children can keep themselves safe. We also include work on friendships and how saying something in a text or via a digital message should be viewed in the same way as saying something to each other in person.
