This term to widen the children's repertoire of things to do at playtimes, we have introduced the children to some traditional playground games. Each Monday in assembly we teach them how to play a different game and this week it has been wonderful to see them playing *What's the Time Mr Wolf?* and *Marco Polo* so well together.



The all-weather surfaces around the adventure play equipment have been repaired so these are now back in use and once the weather improves, we will bring out the skipping ropes and hoops again. The School Council will be working with our Get Active Promoters after half-term to think about what more we could do to improve the experience.

Monday's School Closure

Thank you very much for your understanding regarding the unplanned school closure on Monday. At 10.00am we experienced a power cut but we continued with our timetable of whole school assembly and playtime. We were advised by the authorities that there was a fault with an overhead cable in Parkdale and that they hoped to restore power by 12.30pm.

The number of children having school dinners was over 200 so we realised that we would not be able to provide a meal at 12.00pm. If the power were to come back on, it would be more like 2.00pm before the children had anything hot to eat and we do not have enough provisions stored for a cold alternative for so many children.

Without heating the temperature in school soon started to drop and we realised that the children needed to be somewhere warm, so for the well-being of the children we felt we had no alternative but to inform you of the situation and close the school. We ensured that the children, who were with us at lunchtime, had a sandwich and some fruit to eat and we kept them together indoors in two rooms to play games. I would like to thank the staff, particularly our team of learning support assistants, who all pulled together in the face of adversity and helped manage the situation.

The electricity did come back on at 11.30am but was intermittent for some time. Fortunately, by Tuesday morning full power had been restored!

Thank you to those parents who passed on messages and supported each other with childcare and to Lynne Bage at Woodland Montessori for stepping in. We would ask that you check you have given us the correct contact details. We sent out Data Collection sheets in October but many have still not been returned. Even if there are no changes, we would still like them back as confirmation. If we haven't received your child's form, the teachers will give you a fresh copy at the parent consultations next week. Please check it before you leave school and drop it in the sealed box by the school office or return it the next day via the book bag.

Please be assured that had the situation been an emergency, we would have sent out a text message rather than an e-mail and we would have phoned parents, who had not arrived at school to collect their child.

Class Flamingo's Assembly

Last Friday the children in Class Flamingo started off the Spring Term series of infant class assemblies. They told us all about their topic of explorers and then tested how well the audience had been listening by holding a quick quiz. The children explained their learning clearly and confidently and kept us entertained, particularly with their *Star Wars* inspired dance. Well done!







Emergency School Closures – SNOW!

As we approach the time of year when inclement weather and snow is more likely, we would like to advise you of the school's emergency closure procedure. The decision to close the school is never taken lightly but there may be rare times when the site is unsafe or insufficient staff can get into the school and closure is unavoidable.

We will also put a message out on Parentmail. We aim to do this by 7.30am. Please let the office know if you are not receiving Parentmail messages.

If the weather and traffic are bad, please take care and get to school safely. We will understand if you delay your journey and arrive later than the usual time.

Safeguarding Keeping Safe

Tuesday 5th February was Internet Safety Day. In assembly on Monday we reminded the children about what to do if they come across something unexpected or something they find disturbing when they are on the internet, whether this is part of playing a game or doing research.

It was good to hear that many of them would tell an adult straightaway and our older children knew how to blank the screen without losing the page or site so that an adult could investigate further and take appropriate action including reporting it so that other children are protected.
