Thursday 7th March - Dressing up day 'World Book Day'



We will also put a message out on Parentmail. We aim to do this by 7.30am. Please let the office know if you are not receiving Parentmail messages.


If the weather and traffic are bad, please take care and get to school safely. We will understand if you delay your journey and arrive later than the usual time.

Safeguarding - Keeping Safe

Over half-term there has been lots in the press about the hacking of internet sites and games, particularly those that children may be using unsupervised and that are thought of as "safe", with disturbing and unsuitable material. Our assembly in Monday continued with the theme of keeping safe online and seeking adult help. Again we would urge parents to supervise the time children spend online and to make this a family shared experience.

Parking

We are fortunate to have the use of a car parking space at the front of the school but it does need to be used with care and consideration. Please do **NOT** park where there are **"No Parking"** signs. The grass verge on exiting the car park is also a **no parking** area. These have been designated to ensure that there are no obstructions and traffic can flow in and out of the car park and prevents traffic backing up on Well Lane into Main Road and then onto the zebra crossing. Whilst we appreciate there is limited space, cars should be parked in the parking area and not the roadways and in such a way that they are not blocking in vehicles. We need everyone to adhere to the same rules for the sake of everyone's safety.

Please note that next week a gas supply is going to be installed to the side of the school from Main Road. This may mean that staff will need to park in the front car parking area so places for parents and visitors will be restricted.
