Maths Challenge

On Friday 1st March four Year 6s (Danielle W, Harry A, Maddie D and Isla T) went to New Hall School to participate in a maths challenge against other schools. We sat in the hall at a table and waited for the other schools to arrive; our challenge was about to begin.

The challenge was set out as a story. It was about an archaeologist researching the ancient city of Mathematica and the Numeric people. As a team, we worked together to complete a series of fiendish math challenges.

The first of these was a set of algebraic questions. We had to try and avoid the stones that will make us fall into a pit of fire. At the side, was a mathematical statement: if it was equal to it, it was safe.
