#### **Class Budgerigar**

In class, we have been learning about natural disasters such as volcanoes and tsunamis. During our history and geography lessons, we have looked at volcanoes look like in a cross section diagram and researched the earth's crust. We then used this knowledge to create our first piece of artwork- Batik.

However, when designing the work, we wanted to produce something that looked similar in shape to the originals but had a touch of our chosen artist's style as well.

We studied a Spanish surrealist artist called Miro. Firstly, we did some research about him and analysed his type of work. Once we had this research, we designed our wax work and then started to think about our paintings. We were trying to create a surrealist or magical realism works as they were two of the painting styles Miro was famous for.

Miro uses bold colours, mixes shapes and lines together and mixes real items with creatures to create an overall image. We really enjoyed creating art in this style because there is not a right or a wrong way. It is all about interpretation.

#### **Staffing and Classes for 2019-20**

#### **Working Party**

#### Safeguarding - Keeping Safe

It's now a year ago that the two Johns visited us to talk about keeping our children safe in the digital world.

What was really useful were the strategies they gave parents to support your children: i.e. **NOT** taking devices away or closing down apps, when things go wrong. The approach of talking to your children, exploring new apps together, talking through the dangers and helping them be part of this world is so much safer. Of course negotiating time spent online and establishing ground rules are also vitally important right from the start and this way you can help your child be part of something all their friends will be involved in, but in a safe way. This won't stop situations arising but we hope that the children will be able to talk to you (or us at school) should they encounter difficulties.

The analogy of the children being on a train journey when accessing the exciting digital world and how parents can choose to go along and help them interact with this new way of life or leave them to be exposed to risks and dangers on their own, was very apt.
