#### **Class Eider's Trip to Colchester Zoo**

On Thursday 18<sup>th</sup> July 2019 Class Eider went on a trip to Colchester Zoo. We went to there because it linked to our topic of Save Our Planet, about endangered animals and rainforest animals. We got on the coach and the driver asked us which CD we wanted, The Greatest Showman or Disney and we chose The Greatest Showman and sang all the way!

When we got there the weather was raining. Everybody wasn't that wet because they were in coats but some people were in only jumpers. When we were out of the coach, Miss Chinery started frantically find shelter while she got our tickets and found out information.

After that my group went to the reptiles and we saw poison dart frogs and a very long, green anaconda. There were scaly iguanas and a great piranha fish. Next to the Iguana Forest there were spider monkeys that were climbing a lot of ropes.

We then walked to the penguin enclosure. I found all the penguins quite playful especially in the water. After that we walked to the sealions but instead of walking to it, we walked through it because it was the sealion tunnel. It was amazing, I said, "Wow, this is some place!"

Then we had a snack. After our snack, we headed to the other side of the zoo where we saw red pandas and my favourite, CHIMPANZEES! They were amazing! The only thing was that the chimpanzees had massive bottoms!









After the chimpanzees we wanted to go on the train. We saw some monkeys, lemurs and flamingos. I enjoyed the monkeys because I saw a monkey do an impeccable backflip with no guidance or training! She also told us that there are only two northern black rhinos left in the world and they have guarded next to them so they don't get hunted.

Then we had lunch quickly as a class before we went back to our groups. We went to see the elephants, giraffes and rhinos and also saw the meercats. I wanted to see the orangutan. On the way we could see lions spinning through the waves. When we reached the orangutan forest we read lots of facts. Unfortunately the orangutan was hiding.

We walked to near the butterfly glade and went in to see lots of pretty coloured butterflies. We also saw tigers and tigers, which was very scary. Eventually it was time to go. We listened to Disney on the way back.

The day was so much fun and my favourite animal was the red panda. I learnt that orangutans can't smiles because they don't have strong enough face muscles. It was such a fun day.

#### Safeguarding - Keeping Safe

#### **Local News**

Danbury Parish Council has asked us to pass on the following information:

"There has been considerable discussion on various Facebook pages regarding a den that had been created on Dawson Memorial Field in Danbury. However there was evidence of drug use and extensive damage to the woodland - trees have been cut down, hacked and destroyed. Therefore, the den has been removed on the advice of the police."

The Parish Council was asked to notify local schools of the issues on Dawson Memorial Field in case we were unaware and to pass this information onto parents.

We would urge you to talk to your older children, particularly if you allow them to play on their own in the village, about this issue to ensure that they understand the facts, as there are often many rumours circulating about local incidents, and about the dangers to keep them safe.

Let's work together to keep the children safe!

#### **Pedestrian Safety**

Over the past few months we have been monitoring the flow of traffic and the safety of pedestrians as they come into the front entrance to the school. We have noticed that there has been an increase in vehicular traffic in and out of the staff carpark and we are concerned that this poses a real hazard for families and children.

From September we will be restricting access in and out of the staff carpark and to Woodlands between 8.40 and 9.10am and 3.15 and 3.45pm. There will be cones across the entrance during this period and we are asking staff, visitors and delivery drivers to respect this.

Over the summer the disabled parking bay in the Danbury Outdoors car park will be clearly marked and we ask that parents adhere to the Blue Badge holders only use. We would also ask that parents do not block the access through the carpark at any time.

We are taking action to make the entrance to our school safer and to try to prevent pedestrians being injured. In September there will be more information about the use of Danbury Outdoors carpark.

Please support us by parking with consideration and respect.
