## **Macmillan Fundraising Event**



### Friday 27<sup>th</sup> September

We will again be participating in the Macmillan Coffee Morning this year on Friday 27<sup>th</sup> September.

Last year we made some changes, hopefully to help busy parents and to avoid food being left over and wasted. In previous years, you have been very generous and we have been inundated with cakes but the new system worked very well.

Again this year school will be providing all the cakes and drinks for the children to purchase and the Year 6 children will be running the cake stalls as they have done in the past at break time.

If you would like to support this charity event, then we would suggest that the children bring in a donation of a minimum of £1 in exchange for a cake and a drink of squash. For the infant children, please place the money into an envelope marked with their name and class and put this in their reading bag; junior children may prefer to bring their money in a named purse.

As all proceeds will go to the Macmillan Cancer Charity, we regret that if children do not bring in a donation, they will not be given a cake and a drink.



#### **2019 Harvest Collection**

This harvest we're again asking you to help local people by collecting tinned and dried food for the Chelmsford foodbank. The foodbank provides short term emergency food to people in crisis. Food is given as an intervention strategy which allows care professionals, such as Housing Support Officers, CAB advisers, Social Services, doctors etc, time to put longer term measures in place. People are given enough food for three days. Food is distributed from the foodbank centre based at the Trinity Methodist Church, Rainsford Road.

At the foodbank centre people also have access to information about other services and support organisations. It is open Monday, Wednesday and Friday from 10:00am to 12:30pm. All food given out by the foodbank is donated by generous members of the public. Everyday people experience crisis in our community for a variety of reasons from redundancy to ill health to an unexpected bill on a low income. Some simply struggle to make ends meet.


#### **Harvest Shopping List**

#### Contacting School on First Day of Absence And Keeping our Children Safe

There may be times during the year when your child is unable to attend school for a number of reasons. It is vital that you contact us promptly on the first day of absence and parents should always inform us of the reason. We have a dedicated answerphone on the school number so messages can be left at any time. We do ask that phone messages are followed up by a written note which can be handed in to the class teacher.

Last summer holiday, the Department for Education strengthened its regulations for keeping children safe and we are required to follow these. Our procedure is to check the registers every morning by 9.30am and if your child is absent, and we have not heard from you, we will phone you to establish why your child is not in school. Parents are required to provide at least two emergency contact numbers to the school, so we are able to communicate with someone if we need to. Later this term we will send out our data collection sheets so that you can check that the information we hold is still current and complete. In the meantime if there have been any changes, please let us know in writing.

Please note that where contact cannot be made, a referral may be made to another appropriate agency (Missing Education and Child Employment Service, Social Care or Police).
