Safeguarding

Save the date - Wednesday 10th June 2020

At the DPSA AGM earlier this term, we discussed keeping children safe in the digital age and the committee agreed to support another visit from the 2 Johns. You may know that they came to the school in Summer 2018 and that the children and parents found their information and advice useful and supportive.

On Wednesday 10th June 2020 we will be holding special workshops with all children from Reception through to Year 6 about e-safety. These have been designed and will be led by the specialist team of professionals including police officers and teachers. Our aim is for the children to hear from experts about how to keep themselves safe! After school there will be training for all school staff which will be followed by an information session for parents. In the ever changing world of technology it is vitally important that parents understand what their children are involved in and the risks they face.

To help protect our children, we want as many parents of children present as possible. Whilst parents attend the sessions, the teachers are again organising a Key Stage 2 Film Night so that the junior children have a special social event with their friends. In order for your child to watch the film, a parent must stay and listen to the presentation. Parents of children in EYFS and KS1 are welcome to join us but we are sorry we cannot provide childcare.

PE Kit

We have noticed that many of the children do not have the correct or full school uniform for PE and this is causing problems as the weather is getting colder and damper. Part of our PE curriculum involves outdoor games for all year groups and the children need to have a school track suit to wear.

The children should have:

- T- shirt in blue with logo in maroon,
- Nylon maroon elasticated short,
- Black or white plain trainers, (these are essential)
- Navy blue tracksuit or jogging bottoms and sweatshirt.

Additionally we request that a pair of white ankle or trainer socks be included with the kit. Please note that black plimsolls are no longer required, although for the infants these can be useful at times when shoes get unexpectedly wet.

PE kit should be kept in school in a draw string PE bag as we do not have room for rucksacks or sports bags.

Uniform is available from the One Stop Schoolgear shop at Unit 1 Beehive Business Centre, Beehive Lane, Chelmsford, CM2 9TE and online at www.onestopschoolgear.com and also from My Clothing (previously supplier to Tesco) at https://myclothing.com/danbury-park-community-primary-school/5625.school.

Essex County Council has instructed schools that no jewellery, including earrings, may be worn in any P.E. lesson. This includes earrings that are covered in tape. Please ensure that on days when P.E. or sports based lesson or clubs take place, your child removes his/her earring(s) before school. Alternatively, if your child is able, they can remove the earrings themselves at school. We regret that the teachers are unable to replace any child's earrings after the P.E lesson.

As with all personal property, the school cannot and does not accept any responsibility for any lost earrings or other jewellery brought into school.

Children will not be able to do PE lessons without the correct kit.

Danbury Park School Lottery

Parking

Please remember that the car park is under the management of Danbury Outdoors and they kindly allow our parents to use the car park.

Blocking access to the two sites could cause serious problems should either the school or Danbury Outdoors require urgent assistance. This could put lives at risk.

We remind parents that they should only park in the main car parking area and not alongside the roadways in and out or block the free flow of traffic through the carpark. If there is no space, parents should exit the site and park elsewhere.

We are fortunate as a school to have use of a car park so close to school but it must be used with consideration and care before someone gets injured or parents lose this privilege.
