Weekly Update

This has been another busy week with announcements from the government about the proposed relaxing of social distancing next month. As far as we are aware schools are still required to follow their Risk Assessments and to maintain the maximum size of the bubble for each group at 15 until the end of this academic year, so for the time being we are continuing to operate as we have since the May half-term break.

Unfortunately we have still not received any guidance for schools about September but we continue to work on different scenarios. We are hoping that we will be able to have classes of 30 and open full-time to all year groups. We will let you know what is happening as soon as we are able.

In the meantime we are putting together lots of plans including:

- Invitations for the children who are due to start Reception in September along with one family member to visit their teacher and see their classroom in the next few weeks.
- An opportunity for the children in Years 2, 3, 4 and 5 to come back to school for one day in small groups to be with their teacher and a few friends for one last time and have closure on this year.
- An end of Year picnic celebration for all our Year 6 children together so that they can see each other, receive their dictionaries and say goodbye.

As you can imagine, with all the government and Local Authority guidance, this is taking a lot of planning and organising. However, we stand by our endeavours, to include all the children at Danbury Park School in whatever way we can. Specific detailed information will follow early next week.

Please note that we have rescheduled the INSET day which we missed on 1st June to 22nd July so school will be closed to all children on that day.

Libraries Update

As you may be aware Essex County Council announced its initial plans regarding the reopening of libraries earlier this week and full details about that can be found on their website.

In the meantime their #LibrariesFromHome offer continues and links to our e-library, (for e-books, e-audio, e-comics and e-magazines) online rhymetimes, storytimes and craft sessions can be found on their <u>library</u> <u>catalogue</u>

The national **Summer Reading Challenge** is also moving online this year. The length of time the scheme runs for has also been extended and it launched this week.

Children can take part by going to http://www.sillysquad.org.uk/ and signing up. The sign up process will require parental consent and parents can find more details here: https://summerreadingchallenge.org.uk/parents-carers

Although children must have an account to take part in the actual Challenge, lots of other content will be available on the Silly Squad website and their <u>Facebook page</u> for everyone to explore.

Children will set their own reading goals over the summer and can then take part using their own reading materials, e-books, e-audio and e-comics from the Essex Libraries online library service or (once libraries have reopened) using books borrowed from our libraries.

Each time they finish a book, they add it to their profile and write a review. They are rewarded with activities and incentives along the way, such as online badges, games and videos.

Families are encouraged to join in and 'Get Silly' with downloadable activities, games, quizzes and more. With new content to enjoy each week, the fun will continue throughout the summer to keep families engaged. They also receive a downloadable certificate once they've completed their challenge!

This is going to be a radically different approach for the Summer Reading Challenge, but we hope that many children will still be able to take part and hope that you can encourage you children to do so.

In Essex the Library Service is also going to be working with community partners to get a limited number of physical resources to digitally excluded families during the summer holidays.

Notification and Reminders
