### Weekly Update

This week has been busy and I am pleased to report that we now have hot water throughout the school and the new heating units have finally been installed in the hall and classes D and C. We have also taken time to sort out the classrooms and put in place everything we can in order to make the school as safe as it can be ready for Monday to welcome back our children in Reception, Year 1 and Year 6. This week Miss Bridge returned from maternity leave and although school seems quite different, she is looking forward to meeting the children in Class Jay.

This morning we e-mailed a detailed letter to parents of children in Reception, Year 1 and Year 6 so that they are ready for the "new normal". We will still be open for the children of our critical key workers every day, although please note we will not be able to provide a school dinner on Wednesdays. The government have not changed their criteria for this group and if you are considering returning to work and think you may come under this category, please speak with us first. We are restricted on the number of children we can accommodate because of the need for social distancing, the size of our classrooms and the number of staff available. Please do not be offended if we request evidence that your job is crucial to the COVID-19 response as we need to give priority to those working on the frontline and where there is no other alternative for childcare. We also want our teachers to have the capacity to continue with distance learning for all those children in Years 2, 3, 4 and 5 who can't yet come back to school but need to continue learning from home as best they can.

At this time we are not operating any before or after school clubs but I am sure that there will be many more changes to come over the coming weeks and we will continue to adapt and develop our plans.

## Class News from Class Dove

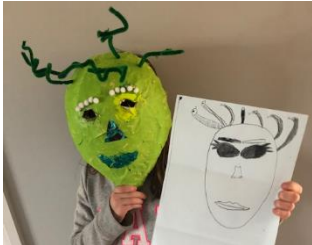
During the last eight weeks, Class Dove have continued to keep busy, to learn and to use their knowledge and skills, whilst working from home.

# Henry III
