

## Danbury Park Treasure Hunt - Instructions

#### **Rules**

Congratulations on receiving your Treasure Hunt pack, hopefully you will find that this provides you with a couple hours home schooling respite, gets you out of the house, allows you to enjoy the scenery of Danbury and you might learn something about our village.

There are three parts to this pack;

- 1) The Treasure Hunt Trail
- 2) The Picture Clues
- 3) The 20 Questions

### The Treasure Hunt Trail

The Treasure Hunt itself should take between 2-3 hours, begins at the War Memorial and ends at St Johns Church. We would stress taking your time, pausing for breath, taking refreshments and enjoying the village. There are a series of riddles/clues to ensure that participants are progressing on the correct path. These are not trick questions; they are slightly cryptic but are just meant to guide your way.

Sadly, our village is dissected by the main road, the trail only crosses this road once and clearly indicates when this is. However, it does proceed up the main road at the beginning and we urge caution, being careful and be road aware.

If you follow these correctly you should pass by all the picture questions and be able to answer a fair number of the observational ones to. Hence being able to appeal to all primary school ages.

Unless you're a Danbury historian you will not be able to answer all the questions! However, participants are allowed some time to research the answers back at home, this is not cheating, it's investigating.

### **Picture Clues**

All the picture questions are on the trail set out, however to make things harder their order has been jumbled up, so you will have to study these hard before you set off, have them to hand as you go around and then keep your eyes open as you progress along the trail.

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### **Questions**

There are 20 questions to answer either before, during or after the treasure trail, they get progressively harder from 1 to 20. The first few are also observational and can be answered by keeping your eyes peeled as you progress around the trail. The last 5 are fiendishly difficult and even answering one of these would be impressive.

The reason for this element is to appeal to all ages, the more questions you can answer either by observation or research the older you are!



## Danbury Treasure Hunt - Directions

These are riddles to guide your journey, starting at the War Memorial. If you follow them correctly, you will walk past all the answers to the picture clues and some of the observational questions too.

The route is a broadly circular one which mainly takes you around the busy main road, please take care crossing the road.

## **DIRECTIONS**

#### START WAR MEMORIAL

- 1 Time to head up the hill towards the church, what an exhausting way to begin this search.
- 2 Keep your eyes out for clues and past the windy bend, head for Eves Corner my dearest friend.
- After that walk you might need new shoes, go towards the shop that's named after another type of footwear.
- 4 There is only one way to head from here, go past a farm with no animals, is that clear.
- 5 That farm must be the Butt of all jokes, away from St John's School, my treasure seeking folks.

#### BE CAREFUL OF THE MAIN ROAD

- At the end of the road, look for a safe place to cross, head to the right and past the pub, this is no time to stop.
- 7 Cross the main road at the pelican crossing, towards the Doctor's surgery now, hopefully no coughing.

#### BE CAREFUL WHEN CROSSING THE MAIN ROAD

- 8 Don't stray too far, you're looking for Copt Hill, once there walk down it just for the thrill.
- **9** At the end of that merry jaunt, the only way is up, or so they taunt.
- 10 Turn into the car park opposite Mayes Field, still seeking answers to the clues you yield?
- 11 Head up the hill towards the light Beacon, no Armada today, you'll find what your seekin.
- Once at the top of this hill, you can see for miles around, now follow the Saffron trail onwards we go.
- Your quest ends at the oldest building in the village, time to reflect and answer the clues on your pillage.

## FINISH ST JOHN'S BAPTIST CHURCH - there are several answers in the graveyard, car park and church surrounds.




