#### **Good news**

As you will know from previous newsletters the school is committed to moving forward with our Sustainability project. Whilst some of our steps have moved back a little because of COVID-19, such as the work of the School Council on reducing the amount of one-time plastics we use in school, other aspects are forging ahead.

Some time ago Mr Gary Hicks, grandfather of one of our Year 5 pupils, was inspired by the children to approach school to discuss our use (or rather possible waste) of electricity. Although in the construction industry by trade for many years, Mr Hicks is in the midst of studying for a doctorate looking at electricity usage in public and community buildings. He asked if he could monitor our electricity usage and this he has been doing now for almost a year. This has led to some interesting data and questions. Over the summer he shared his research project and the work that the school is doing to become more environmentally friendly with the Chartered Association of Building Engineers and this has resulted in him and the school being awarded Highly Commended in the Built Environment Sustainability Awards.

Mr John Whittingdale, MP for our area, visited the school recently to speak with Mr Hicks, his associate Mr David Brown, and a group of children who were involved with this project. Mr Whittingdale was most impressed by the potential of this work and the mature and responsible attitude of our children in wanting to think about the future of our planet.



Today I was interviewed by Chelmsford Community Radio about our project and the work we are planning to do. More information will be shared with you over the coming weeks including our plan to install solar panels!

## Weekly Update

Thank you to everyone who responded so quickly to my Parentmail yesterday.

I had been thinking for some time now about our safety at the beginning and end of the school day. We want drop-off and collection to be as quick a process as possible but this necessarily still involves queues in a limited space.

Given that Essex yesterday announced that it is moving to Tier 2 COVID response, Brenda Wray, Chair of Governors, and I took the decision to ask adults and secondary school-age siblings to wear face masks at the beginning and end of the school day and when visiting the school office. The teaching staff will not be wearing masks to collect or hand over the children as they are part of their school bubble and clear communication is a vital part of primary education. However, if you wish to speak with staff on the school gate, they will put on a mask.

We would like to remind you that:

- Only one adult should drop-off or collect each family,
- Parents are asked to arrive promptly, but not too early as this causes excessive queuing or too late as this compromises the next bubble,
- Families should abide by the government's social distancing and COVID response rules,
- Families should avoid congregating and leave the area promptly.

We want to keep everyone as safe as we can during these difficult times, so your understanding and co-operation is appreciated.

#### **Christmas Cards**

Your child should have brought home a Christmas card design last week together with an instruction leaflet for this year's fundraising. We hope you will be able to support us this year.

# Year 6 Visits to Secondary School

We appreciate that parents and children, where possible, need to visit the local secondary schools before making their selection later this month and that some schools are still holding tours during the school day.

Requests for leave of absence will be automatically authorised for this reason and also for the sitting of the 11+ Tests, but at this time we will not be sending home individual letters to acknowledge this.

Please remember that the statutory closing date for applications from parents of Year 6 children (for a secondary school place in Year 7 from September 2021) is 31 October 2020.

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# **Keeping Safe**

We would appreciate your help in reminding the children about the need to wash their hands thoroughly using an appropriate amount of soap. As we get used to the new normal, we do need to do regular reminders and not become complacent. Whilst we are happy for children to bring small bottles of sanitiser gel into school, these must stay on the child's table and in school. Gel can only be used in conjunction with the school's handwashing regime.

We have also noticed that some children are bringing lip balms into school and we would ask that these are left at home. The only things coming into school should be reading books, diaries, spelling books and some homework sheets. These should be in school book bags. PE kits should be left in school until the half-term break.

Any items for *Let's Present* should come into school in a carrier bag and they will be kept in a safe place and only handled by the child.

| Each term we start our Computing lessons with sessions about online safety. These cover the three core aspects:  |
| Content – Is what you are looking at and sharing appropriate?  |
