Reading Awards

Certificates were presented in class yesterday for those children who passed a reading award during the first half of the Autumn Term.

Half-term Round-up

This half-term has certainly been different in some respects but very familiar in others. It was so good for school to fully re-open in September and the children have all come back eager to learn and be with their friends again. After the first few weeks of practising the new routines, the children settled very well and all the staff are pleased with how well they have adapted and accepted the new normal. I had hoped, perhaps over optimistically, that by now we could have expanded our bubbles to spread over year groups or key stages but the government guidance is still that in primary schools, bubbles should be as small as possible to avoid the mass self-isolation of large numbers of children and staff should we have a case of COVID. We can only hope that things will change in the not too distant future so that the classes can start to mix again particularly at break and lunchtimes.

As you will have seen from the newsletters, we have had a steady stream of children in the juniors moving up reading levels and yesterday I visited the classes to congratulate the children and acknowledge all their hard work this half-term. Each week I also visit the infant classes so that I can present stickers to those children who have learnt their sounds and numbers and also to those who have moved up a reading level or tried particularly hard with a tricky piece of work. This week I finally caught up with Class Flamingo and was amazed at how many children have consistently read for at least three times a week, **every week** since September - it was almost the entire class!



We are obviously a school that enjoys reading and I know that the teachers have been pleased with how well the children are doing. We know that their progress, but more importantly their love of books, is down to the encouragement and support you also give them at home. A good standard of reading unlocks the rest of the curriculum.

Keeping Safe

We have noticed that more and more children are bringing soap, hand cream and sanitiser into school and we now also have children bringing in their own towels. This is becoming problematic as we have limited storage in the classrooms and need to keep everywhere as clear as we can so that surfaces can be thoroughly cleaned during and at the end of the day. Towels also pose a hygiene issue as we do not have space to hang these so that they dry out between use and they will harbour bacteria.

We have sufficient soap in school and this is topped up during the day. Similarly the roller towels are replaced by the office staff as soon as we know that they have run out. There is also a stock of paper towels in each cloakroom.

If your child has a medical condition that requires the use of specialist soap or cream or is going through a period where they have exceptionally sore hands, please let the class teacher know and then we can make suitable arrangements. We need to ensure that any creams brought into school do **NOT** contain nuts as we have children and staff with potentially life-threatening allergies.

Please help us keep everyone as safe as we can during these difficult times. Thank you.


We are hoping to use the commission raised from the sales of these cards to subsidise a whole school virtual pantomime treat for all the children in December.

Safeguarding

Each term we start our Computing lessons with sessions about online safety. These cover the three core aspects:

- Content Is what you are looking at and sharing appropriate?
- Contact Do you know who you are speaking to and interacting with and is this appropriate?
- Conduct Are you behaving appropriately?

This is adapted to suit the age of the children and is made relevant to what they will be using online. In Year 3 as the children move into the juniors, we ask them to sign our *Acceptable Use Agreement*. More information will come from the teachers shortly.


Mobile Phones in School

Over the past few weeks we have noticed that more Year 5 and 6 pupils have started to bring their mobile phones to school. Some of the children in classes Avocet, Budgerigar and Cuckoo are using them to play games when lining up to come into school and this means they are gathering in large clusters and some are reluctant to put them away when the gate opens. At the end of the day children have been seen taking photos of each other and the younger children.

We appreciate that if the children are walking to and from school on their own or with their friends that you want them to be safe and having a phone with them gives them immediate contact in case of need. We are happy to support this but would ask that your child only brings a phone with them, if they are coming to and from school without adult supervision. We will talk to the children about putting phones away before they line up to come into school and not using them until they are on Well Lane.
