Weekly Update

This week has seen the start of the second national lockdown but for schools there is very little change. We will continue to follow our Risk Assessment, which includes:

- Keeping the children within their class bubbles so staggering the start and end to the school day, break times and lunchtimes;
- Regular handwashing throughout the day;
- Limiting the sharing of equipment in school;
- Encouraging the children to stay socially distanced from each other and the adults in school;
- Limiting what equipment and resources are circulated between school and home (and vice-versa);
- Limiting visitors to the school;
- Enhanced cleaning of the classrooms and school;
- Following government guidance and regulations on potential and identified cases of COVID-19.

We are aware that with the weather turning colder and the need for increased ventilation, some children are finding that their classrooms are slightly cooler than they would have been in the past. We are encouraging them to keep their jumpers and cardigans on but we would like to reassure you that we will **not** be keeping doors and windows wide open to the extent that the children are cold. We are adjusting the ways we ventilate the rooms so that we make the most of break and lunchtimes to allow a good circulation of fresh air. Please remember that the children do need their coats in school every day as we will be going outside for regular breaks even if it is raining.

We would like to remind parents and families that at the beginning and end of the school day, there should only be one adult per family dropping-off and collecting children and adults and secondary age siblings should wear masks unless there is a medical reason for not doing so. Families should arrive and leave the school promptly and avoid gathering in groups. We have received a concern from a member of the public that parents have been congregating in the village after drop-off and we would ask that parents set a good example to the children and follow the government ruling. We all want to stay as safe as we can during this difficult time.

Should there be any significant changes to what schools are required to do, we will share this with you.

Children in Need









Friday 13th November

Charities are finding the current pandemic especially challenging so we feel that it is important to support when we can. **Friday 13th November** is *Children in Need* day so we are inviting the children to wear a bright jumper, cardigan or sweatshirt to school in exchange for a donation to the charity. Any donations should be brought into class in a sealed envelope which teachers will give to the office. Given the current situation, we understand if parents would prefer to give a private donation online this year rather than sending cash into school. Please note that the children should wear their school uniform polo shirts, pinafores and trousers etc under their jumpers and please note that we are not doing wacky hair or face paints.

Christmas Plans



We are busy putting together plans for December so that the children can enjoy as much of a traditional Christmas in school as possible. As you can imagine, each activity is having to be carefully thought through so that it is as “COVID secure” as possible. These will include:

-  **Christmas Dinner** – Mrs Hind and her team will be preparing their delicious Christmas dinner, which we will enjoy within our bubbles.
-  **Christmas Celebration** - In place of our large scale infant and junior Christmas plays, each class is working on a presentation combining music, dance and drama. We have booked Keith Bonsor to film the celebrations as he has done in the past and he will produce one DVD for parents to purchase so that families can enjoy the children’s work. In this way the children will also be able to watch their friends in other classes.
-  **Mobile Making** – as we cannot have the usual army of volunteers helping with sewing and design and technology, we are combining our Enterprise project with the making of class mobiles. The children will be making a special ornament to hang on the mobile which we will then sell to parents to raise funds for each class.
-  **Christmas Pantomime** – we have already booked a virtual pantomime which every class will watch in the last week of term.
-  **Christmas Parties** – we will hold some fun activities in our classes on the last day of term.
-  **DPSA** – sadly we cannot hold our Christmas Fayre but the DPSA are getting creative with alternative ideas to raise fund including the traditional raffle.

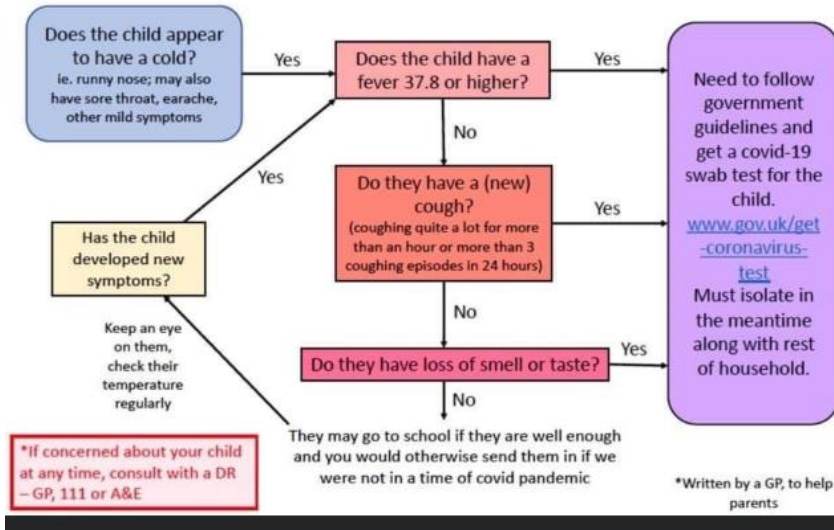

School Lunches - Costs for Autumn Term 2020

2nd Half Term 2 November – 18 December 2019 = 35 days at £2.25 = £78.75

Please send monies in with your child via the book bags in a named envelope making cheques payable to Essex County Council. **We would encourage parents to pay in advance for meals and if possible for the whole half-term.** You will only pay for those meals that your child has and any credits will be carried forward to the next term. Please remember school dinners cost £2.25 per day from September 2020. Thank you. Please note Key Stage 1 and EYFS are still entitled to Universal Free School Meals.

Safeguarding

We still have the 2 Johns booked for the summer term and we hope that by then these workshops will be able to take place. For parents new to the school at the DPSA AGM last year, we discussed keeping children safe in the digital age and the committee agreed to support a second visit from the 2 Johns. In Summer 2018 the children and parents found their information and advice useful and supportive.

On Wednesday 9th June 2021 we will be holding special workshops with all children from Reception through to Year 6 about online safety. These have been designed and will be led by the specialist team of professionals including police officers and teachers. Our aim is for the children to hear from experts about how to keep themselves safe! After school there will be training for all school staff which will be followed by an information session for parents. In the ever changing world of technology it is vitally important that parents understand what their children are involved in and the risks they face.

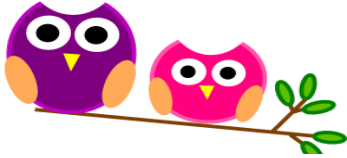

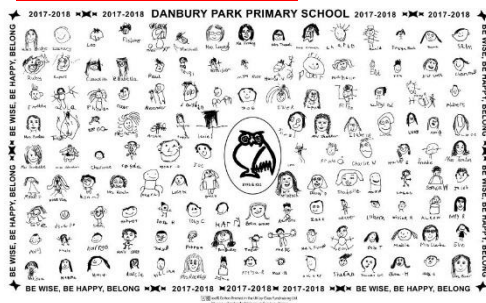
