

### All-weather Track



This week the children have been enjoying using the all-weather track despite the wet weather and it has motivated more children to get back on board with the challenge.



This term we have had an amazing 82% children in Year 3 take up the challenge so in the Spring Term we are looking to encourage every child in Key Stage 2 to take part at least twice a week. We will also be extending the use of the track to the infant children in afternoon break so that they can enjoy the physical activity and develop good habits early.

## Christmas Plays

The Christmas plays went extremely well this year and it was obvious how much the children enjoyed performing for their families.

The junior children told us the classic tale of *A Christmas Carol*, which was done with a sprinkle of humour and lots of singing and dancing.



The infants told the story of the Nativity focusing on the journeys undertaken at that special time. The Year 2 children did a great job of narrating and acting whilst the rest of the children sang their songs with enthusiasm.

The decision to close the school is never taken lightly but there may be rare times when the site is unsafe or insufficient staff can get into the school and closure is unavoidable. Please note that the local radio stations no longer give out announcements.

We will also put a message out on Parentmail and on the scrolling news on the first page of the school website. We will aim to do this by 7.30am.

If the weather and traffic are bad, please take care and get to school safely. We will understand if you delay your journey and arrive later than the usual time.

If you have not yet joined *Parentmail*, please ask at the office.

## Parking

Please remember that the car park is under the management of Danbury Outdoors and they kindly allow our parents to use the car park.

Blocking access to the two sites could cause serious problems should either the school or Danbury Outdoors require urgent assistance. This could put lives at risk.

**We remind parents that they should only park in the main car parking area and not alongside the roadways in and out or block the free flow of traffic through the carpark. If there is no space, parents should exit the site and park elsewhere.**

**We are fortunate as a school to have use of a car park so close to school but it must be used with consideration and care before someone gets injured or parents lose this privilege.**
