Welcome back!

We hope that you all had a good Christmas break and that the new year has started well for you.

School life is always busy and we have lots of activities going on this term. As usual a list of dates is included at the end of the newsletter so that you have plenty of notice and can plan ahead.

We begin our series of infant class assemblies on Friday afternoons on 31st January at 2.50pm with Class Flamingo. For parents new to the school this is a great opportunity to find out what the children have been learning in class as they share their experiences. Whilst we welcome younger siblings, we do ask that they sit quietly and that if they start to get restless and noisy, they are taken out of the hall. This is because the children have worked hard on preparing their assembly and they need to be able to stay focused and be heard. We would also remind parents that food and drink should not be brought into the school for the younger children to consume during the assembly as again this causes a distraction but also poses a significant health and safety risk for pupils and staff with potentially fatal allergies.

We have off-site visits arranged for Class Cuckoo to the Royal Observatory, Class Budgerigar to the British Museum, Year 4 to attend the Superstars sports event and Year 6 to attend the Crucial Crew event; Class Dove have launched their topic work already this week with an on-site activity day around the Mayans; Year 2 will shortly start work on the joint Infant Music Festival production and Classes Hummingbird and Jay are looking forward to a visit from a theatre company to support their topic of traditional tales. Other classes are sorting out their educational visits for this term with Class Eider being in the process of booking their visit to the Maritime Museum in Greenwich.

We have Book Week to look forward to, this year with a focus on story telling using puppets. We have a visit from the NSPCC to help the children think about their personal safety and then at the end of the term we have the traditional Key Stage 2 Spring Celebration.

More details of each event will follow in due course and we hope to see many of you there!

Food in Schools

It is lovely that families want to celebrate their children's birthdays with classmates by sending in sweets to share. However this is beginning to pose a difficulty as we have children and staff in school with potentially fatal allergies, others with intolerances to certain ingredients and those who are vegan, vegetarian or do not consume certain ingredients. In the past teachers have distributed sweets at the end of the day asking the children to take them home to check with their parents before consuming but this, particularly with the older children, is becoming increasingly difficult to monitor and control.

In order to ensure that the children are safe whilst in the care of the school, we ask that parents celebrate their children's birthday at their traditional parties and special events and refrain from sending sweets into school.

Parking

Please remember that the car park is under the management of Danbury Outdoors and they kindly allow our parents to use the car park.
