### Crucial Crew

#### STAY SAFE!

##### Crucial Crew

On Tuesday 28<sup>th</sup> January 2020, our school's Year Sixes travelled to Chelmsford Civic Theatre to learn about keeping safe and staying out of trouble. We would have to complete three workshops - 30 minutes each.

Our first workshop was about weapon awareness, and was led by Henry from Catch ester United football Community. He explained how studies and research showed that knife crime usually affects younger people. There was a story about a man called 'Jamie' who was a removal man. One day, he got into a fight with his old friend - but his friend had a knife. He remembers laying there and seeing all this blood dripping out of his stomach and off his head. The doctors at hospital had to stitch his stomach back together and found he was blind in his right eye.

We learnt about how gangs used music to intimidate others into helping them. This included throwing piles of money into the air like a deck of

cards. We also got told about 'County lines'. These were grooming, benefits, trapped stage (set up) and the hooked stage. Did you know, 2441 knife crimes in Essex were committed and 500 were teenagers.

Our next workshop was with the Essex police. At first, they asked us what we knew. The signals of grooming are quite obvious and if anyone offers to buy you something say 'no thank you' and walk away. They showed us where we could call or talk to to get us out of trouble. They talked about the difference between social grooming and live grooming. Social media grooming is completed online but live grooming is completed face to face.

A role play convinced, scared and showed us what it would be like. It followed the set of: a child is given a bag, they are robbed by a gang member, they return back and a gang member says 'that's your £2000 in debt'. Because the child has no way of paying off the money, they continue working for them to pay it off. Soon the gang member stop being nice and take their phone away. They replace it with one with a GPS tracker and even a micro-chip so they read the message first.

On our last group, we studied 'Drugs and alcohol'. One of the men there worked for a company called 'Alcohol'. He questioned us on what drugs there is and also what alcohol we knew. There was legal drugs and illegal drugs - but they are both seriously dangerous to your mind set and, if they are not controlled, they will kill you. We tried on some special goggles that showed it like if you were drunk.

I did not like wearing these as they hurt my eyes.

In conclusion, I have learnt that you should stay away from strangers, tell an adult if you are worried and stay alert.

**Growing Communities School Dinner Plot Competition**



This year we are again inviting pupils to take part in the RCCE competition. You may remember that three years ago Ava B, who was then in the infants, won the competition and the RCCE team came into school to plant up her plot and to help the class use the new equipment to get the school's vegetable garden under control. Last year Emmy P, one of our juniors, was a runner-up and school was given £150 worth of plants, seeds and gardening equipment to get our plots back on track.

This year the competition has a slightly different focus and is themed on a healthy school **DINNER**. The children need to think about the vegetables, fruit and herbs that could easily be grown to make the perfect healthy school dinner. I explained all about the project in assembly on Monday and those children, who are interested, were given an entry form to take home, so that they can work on their designs over the coming weeks. Entries should be sent into school either with the children or via the school office.

## Class Assemblies

We began our series of infant class assemblies this week with Class Flamingo. For parents new to the school this is a great opportunity to find out what the children have been learning in class as they share their experiences. Whilst we welcome younger siblings, we do ask that they sit quietly and that if they start to get restless and noisy, they are taken out of the hall. This is because the children have worked hard on preparing their assembly and they need to be able to stay focused and be heard. We would also remind parents that food and drink should not be brought into the school for the younger children to consume during the assembly as again this causes a distraction but also poses a significant health and safety risk for pupils and staff with potentially fatal allergies.

## Food in Schools

It is lovely that families want to celebrate their children's birthdays with classmates by sending in sweets to share. However this is beginning to pose a difficulty as we have children and staff in school with potentially fatal allergies, others with intolerances to certain ingredients and those who are vegan, vegetarian or do not consume certain ingredients. In the past teachers have distributed sweets at the end of the day asking the children to take them home to check with their parents before consuming but this, particularly with the older children, is becoming increasingly difficult to monitor and control.

In order to ensure that the children are safe whilst in the care of the school, we ask that parents celebrate their children's birthday at their traditional parties and special events and refrain from sending sweets into school.

## Parking

Please remember that the car park is under the management of Danbury Outdoors and they kindly allow our parents to use the car park.

Blocking access to the two sites could cause serious problems should either the school or Danbury Outdoors require urgent assistance. This could put lives at risk.

**We remind parents that they should only park in the main car parking area and not alongside the roadways in and out or block the free flow of traffic through the carpark. If there is no space, parents should exit the site and park elsewhere.**

**We are fortunate as a school to have use of a car park so close to school but it must be used with consideration and care before someone gets injured or parents lose this privilege.**
