Book Week 2nd March 2020

Our annual Book Week will take place next week and we have lots of fun activities planned for the children:

Monday 2nd March

Paired reading - During the morning each junior class will pair up with an infant class to enable the children to share books with a reading partner. This is an activity that the children all enjoy and look forward to.

Tuesday 3rd March

Story time - All staff in school will bring in their favourite children's book or poems to share with the children. The children will be able to choose which story or poems they want to listen.

Thursday 5th March World Book Day

Dressing up Day and Themed Lunch - As part of our drive to maintain, promote and engage pupil interest in reading we are celebrating our book week with a dressing up day. On this special day your child can come to school dressed as their favourite character from a story book. We look forward to seeing your child dressed up for our special day and there will be photos in next week's newsletter. 


At Danbury Park School we have a wide and varied curriculum and we are particularly proud of our teaching and learning in Science. We want the children to love finding out about how things work and why, through devising their own experiments and investigations and following their own lines of enquiry.

Starting today, on the last Friday of each month the classes will be sharing with you their exciting science learning in our newsletter.

Budgerigar

In February, class Budgerigar has been looking at light. We have found out that we can see objects because they give out or reflect light into the eye. Can you follow the arrows on the diagram to see the light travelling from the from light source to an object and then to our eyes?



In one of our investigations, we found out that light will only travel in a straight line. We used a hole punch to put a hole in two pieces of card and then stuck the card onto a table using blue tack. Next we shone a torch through the holes and saw that when the holes in the cards were aligned, the light from the torch was able to pass straight through but when the cards were not lined up straight then the light did not travel round a bend to get through the hole. Once we proved that light travels in straight lines we then used this



to help us investigate shadows. Did you know that the closer the light source to the object the larger the shadow?

Eider

Science Rocks!

Class Eider are learning about rocks and soils. They particularly enjoyed the chance to observe, draw and describe a variety of rocks from the school's collection.



Jay

This term in Class Jay we have carried out two fun experiments. The first experiment was to discover what happened to pine cones in different weather conditions. We were amazed to see the pine cones open and close depending on where we left them. In the second experiment we were investigating what happened when we mixed different food colours together. We loved the different colours and patterns it made.





Dove

Since January, the children in Class Dove have been studying the area of Sound. We have identified how sounds are made, associating some of them with something vibrating, we have recognised that vibrations from a sound travel through a medium to the ear and that sounds get fainter as the distance from the sound source increases. We are currently looking at patterns between the pitch of a sound and the volume of a sound.



Cuckoo



Class Cuckoo have been busy learning all about space this term.

"I really enjoyed our visit to the planetarium where we were able to take a trip into space. Did you know that Mars has a volcano that is three times the size of the UK!" **Henry**

Flamingo

Class Flamingo are studying the topic of animals and their habitats. We have looked at our local habitats, micro habitats and have begun to look at how animals are adapted to suit their environments. We looked at extremes such as the desert and how animals can survive in such harsh environments. The children researched, asked questions, watched an informative clip online and then recorded their ideas on how a camel is suited to their environment.

Defibrillator (AED)



Thanks to the efforts and support of the DPSA we now have a defibrillator in school. It is located within the building by our front offices and medical room.

Research has shown that an individual's chance of survival following cardiac arrest are greatly improved if CPR and defibrillation are delivered promptly. The unit is easy to use and can be used by anyone as there are step-by-step spoken instructions.

We hope that we never have to use it but it could save a life.

Did you know that last year we re-introduced First Aid training for our children in Year 5 (again paid for by the DPSA) and that it will take place again this year on 29th June.

The decision to close the school is never taken lightly but there may be rare times when the site is unsafe or insufficient staff can get into the school and closure is unavoidable. Please note that the local radio stations no longer give out announcements.

If the weather and traffic are bad, please take care and get to school safely. We will understand if you delay your journey and arrive later than the usual time.

If you have not yet joined Parentmail, please ask at the office.

Parking

Please remember that the car park is under the management of Danbury Outdoors and they kindly allow our parents to use the car park.

Blocking access to the two sites could cause serious problems should either the school or Danbury Outdoors require urgent assistance. This could put lives at risk.

We remind parents that they should only park in the main car parking area and not alongside the roadways in and out or block the free flow of traffic through the carpark. If there is no space, parents should exit the site and park elsewhere.

We are fortunate as a school to have use of a car park so close to school but it must be used with consideration and care before someone gets injured or parents lose this privilege.
