A special well done to **Ethan H** and **Holly B** who have completed the extremely taxing and challenging Year 6 **Kryptonite** Award. Ethan read *Blood Brothers* and *A Christmas Carol* and considered how these texts dealt with social class and divide. Ethan concluded that both works are relevant today as there is still a divide between those who have money and those who don't.

Holly also read *A Christmas Carol* and analysed how the poor were treated in the workhouses. She compared this to social status as portrayed in *Jane Eyre* and concluded that both writers were trying to say that everyone matters regardless of social standing and that everyone can change their ways for the better.

Congratulations to both Ethan and Holly! We are very proud of the hard work you put into these tasks and of the high standard you consequently achieved.

Weekly Update

This week you should have received the e-mails and letters with details of the changes and events that are taking place over the next two and a half weeks. We want to offer those children in Years 2, 3, 4 and 5, who have not been in school since March, the opportunity to see some of their friends and to be with their teachers for one last time before the summer break. We also want to welcome our new entrants and their parents into the school for a brief visit so that they can see us face-to-face before September.

Yesterday we received the guidance from the government on schools re-opening in September. It seems that, all being well, we will be fully open for all children and working within our class "bubbles" as close to normal as we can. At the moment there is a lot of detail to absorb and work through to ensure that the children and staff are as safe as they can be. As soon as we have revised our Risk Assessments, we will share with you the practicalities and logistics of how this will work. Please do not worry!

Please note that school is closed on Wednesday 22nd July to all pupils for staff training. This is to replace the INSET day that was scheduled for 1st June.

End of year Arrangements

As we come to the last few weeks of this academic year, the teaching staff are busy maintaining our blended learning as well as making arrangements for those children who have not been in school to return for a day. As we will be seeing many children in school over the next two weeks and as teachers will not have as much time as in the past to make phone calls home, please do not worry if you do not hear from us. If you need any advice or support, please contact the teachers directly or phone the school office and we will get back to you as soon as we can.

If your child is not in school their end of year report can be collected from the school office from 13th July between the hours of 10.00am and 2.00pm. We regret that we cannot collect topic folders and art work from classrooms during the working day as most rooms are in use and we need to maintain our safety regime. Please do not worry, these items will be kept safe and your child will be able to take them home in September.

We are in the process of finalising classes for next year and on the morning of 20th July teachers will send you an e-mail to let the children know who their teacher will be. We are sure that many of them will have worked it out already! The teachers will also be setting their new class a project for the summer holidays, to do if they wish.



I drew out the plan and here was the finished design

My school plan:



When I finished my plan, I started to construct my final design.

As my base, I used a large piece of cardboard. For the items I put on my plan, I used other pieces of cardboard so it would look 3D. I also used a colour code with all the areas; the classrooms all had different colours and all of the communal areas were painted white. I left the hallway brown and also made some doors to show entrances/exits in and out of classrooms. I added a swimming pool with a shower block

as I felt this would be beneficial for students.

Moving on to the outside area, I made a car park which had spaces for 20 cars, and leading to a path down the back for the kitchen deliveries.

The main outside area is the field, which includes a running track, a netball/basketball court and an outside eating area with picnic tables and benches. This then leads onto the play equipment space.

This was a very fun task designing and making my own school and I would very happily attend this school!

Notification and Reminders

School Trips – these have all now been cancelled for the rest of the term. Where parents have already paid for The Maritime Museum and tickets for the Year 2 Infant Music Festival, we are holding the monies on account in the child's name to carry forward for future trips. We are doing this to save time spent on issuing cheques as this is a lengthy administrative process but if you require the refund, please contact the school office and we will arrange this for you as soon as we can.

Year 6 School Journey – We are still working with Essex County Council insurance to seek repayment of the £150 deposit per pupil paid by parents but this may take some time. We are able to give refunds on the rest of the monies paid but if you are able to wait until we have the full monies back, this would help. Writing out 37 cheques twice is time consuming! We will post these to you as soon as we can, should you not have any younger children at the school.

Please note that we have moved our INSET day from 1st June to 22nd July so school will be closed on that Wednesday to all children and for the summer break.
