## **Weekly Round-up**

The Daily Mile continues to go from strength to strength and is popular with all the children. Whilst the junior children have priority using the track in their class bubbles at lunchtimes, the infants make use of it when there is space and during their afternoon break. It gives the children a chance to get some physical exercise and of course lots of fresh air.

Each week now we are running a junior interclass competition to see how many laps each class can clock up over the course of the week. The results are declared each Friday afternoon. Last week's winners were

We are now entering the last two weeks of term and we know that the children are getting tired. In between our daily structure of lessons, we will find time for some fun festive activities particularly as we move into the very last week. Today the mobiles should be going up in the hall and the teachers will be sending you a letter about how we are asking for money to cover the costs of making them but also, as we have not been able to hold our usual class enterprise stalls at the Christmas fair, for donations to raise funds for each class. Photos of the mobiles will follow next week.

Without a clear directive from the government about children bringing Christmas cards into school, we have decided that the children can't wait any longer and so are putting into place our own plan! The children may bring in cards but they need to be clearly marked with the recipient's name and class. We ask that parents sort the cards into class bundles and secure them with elastic bands/string. We cannot ask the Year 6 children to sort and deliver the cards, so this will be done in each class by adults. The cards need to be brought into school next week and by FRIDAY 11<sup>th</sup> Dec at the latest so that they can be left in quarantine over the weekend. The envelopes must be tucked in at the back, secured with sellotape or left open. We must prevent the spread of the virus so on no account should they be licked! Whilst we appreciate that some children may want to exchange gifts, this needs to be done as a family outside school as we do not want any unnecessary items brought into classes.

# Class News Class Flamingo



We have been very busy in Class Flamingo enjoying our learning on Time Travellers which means we are learning all about life in medieval times and what life was like for various people who lived in a castle. We have learnt about all the different jobs within the castle (ask the children what a gong farmer did! None of Class Flamingo fancied that job!), how to become a knight, what people ate, what they did for entertainment, what castles around the world look like and who built the first castles. Do you like our shields we made?





We have also been learning about materials in Science and have enjoyed many investigations linked to the suitability of materials and changing materials.









We have been looking at a variety poems in English. This has included shape poems, riddles and acrostic poems. The children have enjoyed reading, listening to and performing some poems too. We have learnt about the different styles of poems and some special words used like onomatopoeia! We have discovered there a lot of words we like to say over and over again!

#### Class Budgerigar

This term class Budgerigar have been looking at the Victorians and started the term with a biography of Queen Victoria to go along side learning different pencil techniques in art.







The class have produced some excellent Victorian samples learning a variety of different stitches and have investigated the designs of William Morris.

They have found out about life in Victorian times and have delved into a Victorian artefacts box from Essex Library Services where they were asked to work out what they would have been used for and if there was any modern equivalent.












The age of the railways was a big part of our learning this term and the class found out about impact of the Industrial Revolution and its need for coal to power the new steam engines. In this way we made the link between the need to get coal from the mines to the growing industrial centres initially on horse drawn wagons then wagons on tracks pulled by horses (wagonways) to putting static steam engines on tracks! The Rainhill Trials of 1829 captured their interest and led to finding out more about the engineer George Stephenson and his son, Robert.











Did you know that the first inter city passenger railway line was between Manchester and Liverpool and the track is still used today? It is thirty one miles long and took four years to build. It included tunnels, crossed Chat Moss (a thirty five square acres of boggy land), a nine arch viaduct across Sankey Valley and sixty four bridges. This led us to Isambard Kingdom Brunel and bridges. In DT the class were given three bridge building challenges using either straw or paper.

This is just a flavour of some of the exciting learning that happens in class Budgerigar and as many of you will be unable to view the Christmas mobiles that will be up in the hall this year, class Budgerigar has continued with the Victorian theme by making a Victorian peg doll choir.

# Essex Libraries Winter Reading Challenge



### **Contacting Teachers**

These are challenging times at the moment and whilst we are working hard to maintain contact with parents, we are having to limit the face-to-face contact we can have with parents in order to keep us all as safe as possible.

If you wish to contact your child's class teacher please either send an e-mail to the class e-mail address (e.g. <a href="mailto:classg@danburypark.essex.sch.uk">classg@danburypark.essex.sch.uk</a> or telephone the school office.

Please remember that in primary schools, teachers are in class with the children all day except for their brief weekly allocated Planning, Preparation and Assessment time. They will phone you when they are able to do so but this is likely to be at the end of the working day. Urgent messages can be left with Mrs Brooke, Mrs Packham and Mrs Warner in the office.

Please note that the teachers only respond to e-mails during the normal working day which is Monday to Friday from 8.30am to 5.30pm and that this is more likely to be before or after school when they are not directly teaching their class.

#### **Notification and Reminders**

Items from Home coming into School - We have noticed over the past week that some of the children are starting to bring into school unnecessary items including Pokemon cards. Please could you check book bags and coat pockets so that only essential items are brought into school. This is to keep us all safe and limit the transfer of infection and the spread of the virus.

Track Suits for PE – We do outdoor PE all year round and with the weather turning colder, all children need a track suit in school for their outdoor PE lessons. This should be navy blue. For girls who wear tights, they also need a pair of socks to wear to prevent their trainers rubbing their feet. It is unhygienic, particularly for the older children to wear their normal school jumper or coat for physical exercise as they do get hot and sweaty!

**Free School Meals** – Due to Covid-19 we understand that your circumstances may have changed or may change in the near future and you may now be eligible for free school meals. 
School Lunches - Costs for Autumn Term 2020
