Weekly Update

At the end of our second week back after Christmas, we are beginning to settle into yet another new normal and find our way through what we now know will be school closure until at least February half-term.

As you know at Danbury Park we are always anxious to provide the very best we can for the children, and the teachers and teaching assistants have gone above and beyond over the past two weeks acting swiftly to put work in place and supporting families. We have now discussed how we can make this manageable and sustainable for the children, the staff and parents long term. Today in addition to this newsletter, you will receive a second Parentmail explaining how remote education will work over the coming weeks and we ask that you look out for this and spend some time reading it over the weekend.

We have two small groups of children of critical key workers in school and we thank those parents who have followed the guidance and are only taking places where there is no adult working from home and there is no alternative. Whilst the COVID infection rate is still very high, we must keep the mixing of households and exposure to the virus to the minimum. This way we protect our families and our staff. We would like to thank all those who are working tirelessly in the NHS and particularly on the frontline at this time covering additional shifts to help save lives.

The teachers have been very impressed by all the work that the children have been completing and they have enjoyed their "live" teaching sessions this week seeing and talking with them. We know how difficult this situation is for them and know how important personal contact is! Whilst the majority of our children are learning from home, each week in the newsletter we will celebrate some of their work so that we can continue to share our experiences and achievements.

Please remember that we are still here for you and that the office is open every day. If you need any support either phone the office or contact the class teacher via their class email.

Safeguarding Keeping your Children Safe Online

The children will be going online more over the coming weeks and the teachers are reminding them about protocols for using Google Meets. Below is a reminder of our Acceptable Use Agreement and Online Safety Rules:

When using Google Classrooms, adults and children should remember to think about:

- Content Is what you are looking at and sharing appropriate?
- Contact Do you know who you are speaking to and interacting with and is this appropriate?
- Conduct Are you behaving appropriately?

Our Code

- We use our own personal login and password and we don't share it with others.
- By using our personal login and password, we are consenting to participate in the stream.
- We keep our personal information such as our address, date of birth or phone number private.
- We use school-allocated email addresses, not personal ones.
- We do not use video-conferencing on a one to one basis and use it only when instigated by an adult.
- During online activity, we will be in a neutral area (i.e. not in a bedroom or bathroom).
- We make sure that other people cannot reproduce and distribute the stream.
- We only send files or comments that are relevant for learning.
- If you are worried about anything you see or hear when using Google Classrooms, you can let Mrs Gooding know by phoning the school on 01245 224994 or by e-mail at <u>admin@danburypark.essex.sch.uk</u>.

Remember that your child can also use their Xbox or PlayStation to access Google Classrooms. Both consoles are simple and there are instructions online: <u>https://www.pocket-lint.com/apps/news/google/155204-how-to-use-google-classroom-on-xbox-and-playstation</u>.

You can do this on the following devices: Xbox One, Xbox Series S, Xbox Series X, PlayStation 4, PlayStation 4 Pro or PlayStation 5

You will just need a USB Keyboard to plug into that device to enable this function. Remember also to set parental controls.

Keeping in Touch

As in the previous school closure, schools have been asked to ensure that we have regular contact with children and parents. The children will be taking part in at least weekly Google Meets with their teacher and we know that parents often make an appearance helping their children login. Many of you have also been e-mailing teachers with questions.

To help us manage this "keeping in touch" responsibility, we would ask that once a week, you send your children's class teachers a brief e-mail to say that you are okay or ask for help if you need it. Some of you will already be in regular contact with Mrs Trussell and with the school office but if we don't hear from you, please don't be offended if we phone just to see if the family is okay and if there is anything we can to do to help.

For anything urgent or more serious, please phone the school office. It is manned from 8.30am – 4.00pm every week day and either Mrs Gooding or a senior member of staff will be on duty and able to help. We are here to support you!

COVID-19 Support

Schools are still being asked to collect information for the government and even if your child is not eligible to be in school, we still need to be informed if your child tests positive for COVID-19 or is isolating due to being in direct contact with a case. You can do this by leaving a message on the school answer phone, speaking to the office staff or by e-mail.

Emergency School Closures – SNOW!

As we approach the time of year when inclement weather and snow is more likely, we would like to advise you of the school's emergency closure procedure. The decision to close the school is never taken lightly but there may be rare times when the site is unsafe or insufficient staff can get into the school and closure is unavoidable. Please note that the local radio stations no longer give out announcements.

We will also put a message out on Parentmail and on the scrolling news on the first page of the school website. We will aim to do this by 7.30am.

If the weather and traffic are bad, please take care and get to school safely. We will understand if you delay your journey and arrive later than the usual time.

Even though school is only open to a small number of children, we may still have to close in adverse weather conditions.

Notification and Reminders

Free School Meals – Due to Covid-19 we understand that your circumstances may have changed or may change in the near future and you may now be eligible for free school meals. Nut allergies – Please do not include nuts of any kind including peanut butter in your child's lunch box due to the risk of severe allergic reactions. Thank you.

Please send monies in with your child via the book bags in a named envelope making cheques payable to Essex County Council. We would encourage parents to pay in advance for meals and if possible for the whole half-term. You will only pay for those meals that your child has and any credits will be carried forward to the next term. Thank you. Please note Key Stage 1 and EYFS are entitled to Universal Free School Meals.
