Weekly Update

Welcome back to the second half of the Spring Term and to the good news that schools will be re-opening to all children from 8th March! The staff at Danbury Park School all breathed a sigh of relief as with the falling infection rate and success of the vaccination programme, we can now see a light at the end of the tunnel and we look forward to seeing the children back in school.

We do have to remember, however, that the country is still in lockdown and that the virus is still an ever present danger. We are reviewing our Risk Assessment and will do all that we can to keep children and adults as safe as we can at this time. We will continue with the practices that we had in place in the Autumn Term and today, you will receive a separate letter via Parentmail to remind you of the details. We know that the children will be excited to return to school and see their friends and that some will be nervous. We will be taking things slowly and allowing time for them to get used to being back in a classroom and to remind them of our routines. Life has certainly not returned to normal so please be patient if reading books are not changed as quickly as you would hope! We ask that parents set a good example by dropping off and collecting children on time, leaving the site promptly and that you observe all social distancing regulations.

We are aware that some children left their PE kits in school in December. We are sorry but we cannot encourage non-essential visits to school to collect these at this time and we still only have a skeleton staff on site. We will send these home on Monday 8th. Please could these be washed and returned the next day as PE lessons will take place.

The teachers are busy organising parent consultation meetings to take place before the Easter break. These will be either using zoom/Google Meets or telephone if you would prefer. A letter will be sent out next week with details.

Next week is Book Week and the teachers have planned a range of activities around a chosen book or story. This is something we always do, although this year in a slightly different format. The office will send you a link via Parentmail for your child's electronic Book Token so that you can purchase one of the special books. We hope that this will be a different and interesting week for your child as we prepare to switch back to teaching in person. For this reason Google Meets may operate differently and all class work needs to be uploaded by noon on Friday 5th March. There is certainly a lot happening behind the scenes to get ready for Monday 8th!

Safeguarding

We have received the following warning from the 2 Johns regarding children playing ROBLOX and broadcasting live on TIKTOK:

Over the past week it has become a significant trend for children to use TIK TOK Live to broadcast via Live Stream to numerous random people. Children are posting videos on TIKTOK and then promise to go live if they can hit the required 1000 followers on TIKTOK. Once they go Live they can then connect real time with everyone. Many children are now Live Streaming themselves playing the massively popular game 'Adopt Me' in ROBLOX. They are using their Live Stream to shout out for followers to play with them on ROBLOX in particular 'Adopt Me'

In their Live Stream they are giving people a shout out if they give them a cool pet within Adopt Me. We have watched a Live Stream today and within 15 minutes a young girl had managed to add numerous people to her friends list on ROBLOX, many of these in turn were then giving her 'Pets'. Normally you would have to spend a lot of money to obtain the pets she now has. The girl was using the TIKTOK live interface to then communicate with the people who had donated the expensive pets.

It was very clear from the nature of the chat that the situation was highly exploitative. In addition the girl was then putting up screen shots of her friends accounts and encouraging the viewers to friend them and donate pets to them. She was filming a friends account as the friend count immediately started to grow.

We have been talking extensively about children using third party chat apps to get around chat restrictions in games but this is the first time we have seen gaming chat being carried out over TIKTOK. It's our belief that if this situation follows the normal trends then many of our children could copy this and put themselves at risk of harm. The Pandemic has had a profound impact on children and we are alarmed by the number of them that appear to be Live Streaming on various apps, in many cases they appear to go to their 'Followers' online to replace the normal interaction they have with their peers at school.

Used safely utilising the safety features in ROBLOX we have no issues with the game Adopt me, our issue relates to the use of 3rd party apps to circumnavigate the various safety features.

The decision to close the school is never taken lightly but there may be rare times when the site is unsafe or insufficient staff can get into the school and closure is unavoidable. Please note that the local radio stations no longer give out announcements.

We will also put a message out on Parentmail and on the scrolling news on the first page of the school website. We will aim to do this by 7.30am.

If the weather and traffic are bad, please take care and get to school safely. We will understand if you delay your journey and arrive later than the usual time.

Even though school is only open to a small number of children, we may still have to close in adverse weather conditions.
