Weekly Update

The children at Danbury Park continue to amaze us and they have returned to school full of energy, enthusiasm and obvious delight. After the initial first day flutters of trepidation, the children soon realised that everything in school was as they left it: the same lining up routines, washing hands, lessons, playtimes etc. They were so pleased to see their friends on Monday and we have allowed them plenty of time to catch up with each other and to settle down.

The teachers are continuing with their Spring Term class plans so that we can complete the curriculum as best we can but they are taking time to gather information about where the children are in their learning. They are hearing the children read so that where ready they can move up to the next band, they are checking on the application of learned spelling patterns and for gaps in mathematical knowledge as they work through new units. There is also time for PE together in their bubbles and art and DT work. We place great emphasis on our wider curriculum and this is something we have never sacrificed as it gives every child the opportunity to shine, whatever their strengths. The work we are doing over this week and the coming two weeks will help us adjust and adapt the summer term curriculum, so that we can help the children bounce back in the best way possible!

There has been little in the way of information from the Department for Education about the coming months and we have been advised by the local authority for the time being not to book any educational visits and to only make very tentative plans for late June and July. Although the government's plan is to lift restrictions on 21st June, this is only an indicative date and so much has to fall into place before that milestone is reached. After the Easter break we hope to have more detail and we will then share with you our own provisional plan for events for the late summer term.

This week you should have been notified about your appointment for parent consultation meetings starting next week. Some teachers may have printed off a slip which has been glued into your child's reading diary so please check both your e-mails and the books. We have tried to accommodate requests where we can but as you can imagine the changeover from remote education to being back in school has not been without its challenges.

Sadly at the end of this term Mrs Steph Packham, one of our admin assistants, will be retiring. She is looking forward to being able to spend more time with her family and particularly her grandchildren but we will miss her excellent organisation, efficiency and positive disposition. However, we are looking forward to seeing her back in school as a class volunteer. The recruitment process is underway and we will share with you any news in due course.

Sustainability and Caring for our World



As you will all know our school had solar panels installed last October. These panels will save our school around £5,000 on energy bills and avoid the emission of 9.9 tonnes of carbon (CO2e) every year. The solar panels were funded by Essex County Council as part of an EU funded project called Empower 2.0.

Did you know that families can also do their bit for the environment and save money on electricity bills too? Essex County Council has asked us to share with you the following opportunity for families to also benefit. Just join <u>Solar Together Essex</u> - this is a group buying scheme to help people interested in purchasing solar panels. It helps buyers through the process of purchasing high quality solar panels, offering lower prices than the open market and pairing up residents with trusted suppliers. <u>Register your interest</u> for free by 23rd March. You will receive a personal quote and it's up to you if you decide to purchase, there is no obligation.

COVID-19 Support

Now that we are coming back to school and households will be mixing within class bubbles, it is vital that parents are vigilant for signs of COVID and act promptly. Please inform us if your child has suspected COVID or tests positive for COVID-19. You can do this by leaving a message on the school answer phone, speaking to the office staff or by e-mail.

We thought this might be useful to parents in trying to decide if their child needs a test.



COVID Home Testing

Last Friday week Essex County Council wrote to primary schools asking us to support them with a pilot of a new national scheme for home testing of families with children attending school. Essex were asked to pilot this scheme so that the local postal system could be tested over last weekend if possible, prior to the national launch. The DFE have now announced the launch of this scheme nationally.

Households, childcare and support bubbles will now be eligible for twice-weekly home testing. Those individuals will be able to order a box of lateral flow tests to be delivered to their home (or they can collect from a convenient location).

It is important to note that this scheme is not for staff or secondary students who should use the school based kits, or for primary pupils who are still not eligible for testing. The kits are for the remaining household, support or childcare bubble adults.
