Weekly Update

It seems hard to believe that a year has passed since we first went into lockdown and that we are again at the end of another term. We fully acknowledge what has happened and that we are still living with many challenges but at Danbury Park we are concentrating on the future and we are *bouncing back and bouncing higher*! Since we came back to school on 8th March, we have lost no time in assessing where the children are in their learning and adapting our teaching. Mrs Booth, Class Avocet's teacher on Thursdays and Fridays, has additionally been in school at the beginning of each week to support the Year 6 pupils. Mrs Booth and Mrs Eveleigh have worked together and given the children the opportunity to work in various break-out groups to concentrate on tricky aspects of the curriculum. Even though this has been for a relatively short time, we have seen the children grow in confidence and gain in knowledge and skills. After the Easter break Mrs Booth will continue with this for one final week before moving on to work with our other Key Stage 2 classes. She will be working alongside the class teachers and learning support assistants so that the children can work in smaller focused groups for a sustained period of time benefitting from two experienced teachers.

After Easter Mrs Rush, one of our experienced infant LSAs will be working additional afternoons in classes Goldfinch and Flamingo to support those children who would benefit from a nudge in the right direction and Mrs Thirkettle and Mrs Thakkar will be starting work on the NELI programme in Classes Hummingbird and Jay to aid the development of early literacy skills with selected children. Sadly the catch-up funding provided by the government will not go far but we are focusing our attention where it will have the most impact and where as many children as possible will benefit.

We are looking forward to when we can return to more normality and particularly the starts and end to the school days and breaks and lunchtimes. When we can, we are considering changing the timetable so that lunchtime for every child is reduced from 60 to 50 minutes and adjusting the end of the school day by 10 minutes so that we finish at 3.15pm which would allow better timings for after school clubs and events. We know that this may not be able to happen until September but we want to look ahead so that we are ready. As ever we would value your thoughts and opinions.

I hope that you have a good Easter break. Please stay safe and we look forward to seeing everyone back on Monday 12th April ready for the summer term.

Easter Carbon Footprint Project Getting our Families and the Wider Community Involved

As you will know Danbury Park School is working closely with Essex County Council on our sustainability project and together we recognise that to reach a carbon zero target by 2030 requires positive action not just objectives. As you may be aware with the support of Mr Hicks, the grandfather of one of our former pupils, we have been monitoring our electrical use over the last year and we are taking further steps to reduce our carbon footprint. A lot is said about people's carbon footprint, but it is very difficult to define the actual impact of our actions.


Over the Easter period we would like to involve our families in widening this project and helping the children and parents understand further what more we can do. As part of this we want to be able to measure the impact of our actions. The link below is to a website where families can easily generate a figure that is representative of a household's carbon impact. By the nature of these sites, it is not an entirely accurate result, but it will give an indication of different levels at different houses. We do not fully support this site or agree with several of the statements it makes but having looked at other alternatives, it is probably the easiest and quickest one to produce a meaningful figure.

We are asking families to take just a few minutes over the Easter break to fill in the details, preferably with the children present, press the view/print button at the end and screenshot the results. We would then like this information to be emailed to the class email so that we can collate the information. This information will not be saved or recorded against any individual house or family so you cannot be identified but it will be used as a general statement as to how different homes produce different results.



GOVERNOR NEWSLETTER

Spring Term 2021



Dear Parents,

As advised by our Headteacher, Danbury Park School is now 'bouncing back' after the most recent lockdown, during which all Staff co-operated to produce first-class remote learning, as well as providing learning for the children of key workers. The governors are extremely grateful for all their hard work. During the lockdown we continued our monitoring role via Zoom or the telephone and were kept up to date with all the Covid arrangements and Risk Assessments. Committee meetings were held as usual and the chairs would like to report as follows:

Curriculum and Pupil Related - Chair, Mrs. Katherine Moulding

- Despite the restrictions imposed by the 3rd national lockdown, Governor monitoring visits continued remotely, covering Safeguarding, SEND provision, Early Years Foundation Stage, Key Stage 1 English and Key Stage 2. Pupil Well-Being support provision was also examined.
- The committee started to examine the effectiveness of measures the School was able to implement from the government's Covid19 Catch-Up funding and have been pleased with the positive impact so far. This work will continue during the Summer term.
- The committee examined the Remote Learning provision and were pleased to note that the School's offer exceeded the standards expected in the Department for Education's Remote Education Provision Publication.

Resources - Chair, Mr.Rak Rehal

- As usual the Resources Committee have been working closely with the School to ensure that appropriate financial funding is in place to fully support operations during these challenging times.
- The Committee has also supported the various sustainability actions the school is involved in. You will be aware that related to this we had Solar Panels installed, which demonstrates Danbury Park is a leading school in this initiative.

Personnel – Chair, Mr.Peter Irvine

- The wellbeing of staff and pupils remains an essential part of the committee's work; the School Covid Risk Assessment has been updated now the School has reopened.
- Governor Risk Assessment Log: the risks associated with the Personnel Committee were reviewed and amended.



COVID-19 Support

Now that we are coming back to school and households will be mixing within class bubbles, it is vital that parents are vigilant for signs of COVID and act promptly. Safeguarding

Now that the children are getting used to being back in school and some of our older children are walking on their own, it would be a good time to remind them about road safety. Main Road and the roads around the village do get very busy in the mornings and at the end of the school day. A gentle refresher in road safety would go a long way!

In April we will be participating in the annual *Sustrans Big Pedal* event which inspires pupils, staff and parents to be amazing and take active journeys to school.

On each day of the challenge, schools compete to see who can get the highest percentage of their pupils, staff and parents cycling, walking, wheeling or scooting to school. The school's best five days will determine our final position, but we can log journeys on all ten days if you wish.
