Weekly Update

The waiting is nearly over and we are looking forward to Monday when all the children will return to school. I think this lockdown has been harder that the first with colder weather inhibiting the opportunities to play outside and the feeling that we have done this all before. We hope that as a school we have found the right balance in providing remote education. We acknowledge that for many parents juggling several children all learning something different at the same time, using shared and unreliable technology as well as trying to do your own work has been a tall order.

I would like to make particular mention of the children of our critical key worker families, some of whom have been in school every day. For them this has been a particularly difficult time when they know parents' work is essential and they have to come to school but their friends are enjoying the freedoms of being at home — playing with their toys and games once school work is done, wandering out into the garden to play football or on their swing. Even being able to contact each other as and when they want. They have coped incredibly well.

This has been because the children have been so caringly supported by our team of learning support assistants who have been in school every day. I would like to thank them for everything they have done over the past eight weeks which has been above and beyond! They have been flexible in changing their working days and times so that we can cover every day allowing teachers to work from home and concentrate on the remote education for the majority of children. They had to quickly learn how to use Google Classrooms, set up Google Meets and although we had three groups, within each group there were often children from up to 5 classes each trying to follow their own programme of work as set by their class teacher. A heartfelt thank you from everyone!

As we prepare to return to school, I know that some teachers have asked that children bring in a specific piece of work. This will be used either for display or to continue a series of lessons. These will all be quarantined before use. Please do **NOT** send in any other completed work or items from home other than those specified in the detailed letter sent home last week. Teachers have responded to work as it has been uploaded and we do not need to keep any physical copies in school as they are all stored electronically. As you know we do not have lots of free space and we want to keep everyone as safe as we can at this time.

Today you should receive a letter from your child's class teacher about arrangements for parent consultation meetings, so please watch out for this. As we finalise the preparations, I hope that you have a good weekend and I look forward to seeing you all on Monday!

Safeguarding

We have received the following warning from the 2 Johns regarding children playing ROBLOX and broadcasting live on TIKTOK:

Over the past week it has become a significant trend for children to use TIK TOK Live to broadcast via Live Stream to numerous random people. Children are posting videos on TIKTOK and then promise to go live if they can hit the required 1000 followers on TIKTOK. Once they go Live they can then connect real time with everyone. Many children are now Live Streaming themselves playing the massively popular game 'Adopt Me' in ROBLOX. They are using their Live Stream to shout out for followers to play with them on ROBLOX in particular 'Adopt Me'

In their Live Stream they are giving people a shout out if they give them a cool pet within Adopt Me. We have watched a Live Stream today and within 15 minutes a young girl had managed to add numerous people to her friends list on ROBLOX, many of these in turn were then giving her 'Pets'. Normally you would have to spend a lot of money to obtain the pets she now has. The girl was using the TIKTOK live interface to then communicate with the people who had donated the expensive pets.

It was very clear from the nature of the chat that the situation was highly exploitative. In addition the girl was then putting up screen shots of her friends accounts and encouraging the viewers to friend them and donate pets to them. She was filming a friends account as the friend count immediately started to grow.

We have been talking extensively about children using third party chat apps to get around chat restrictions in games but this is the first time we have seen gaming chat being carried out over TIKTOK. It's our belief that if this situation follows the normal trends then many of our children could copy this and put themselves at risk of harm. The Pandemic has had a profound impact on children and we are alarmed by the number of them that appear to be Live Streaming on various apps, in many cases they appear to go to their 'Followers' online to replace the normal interaction they have with their peers at school.

Used safely utilising the safety features in ROBLOX we have no issues with the game Adopt me, our issue relates to the use of 3rd party apps to circumnavigate the various safety features.

As you will all know our school had solar panels installed last October. These panels will save our school around £5,000 on energy bills and avoid the emission of 9.9 tonnes of carbon (CO2e) every year. The solar panels were funded by Essex County Council as part of an EU funded project called Empower 2.0.






COVID-19 Support

Now that we are coming back to school and households will be mixing within class bubbles, it is vital that parents are vigilant for signs of COVID and act promptly. Please inform us if your child has suspected COVID or tests positive for COVID-19. You can do this by leaving a message on the school answer phone, speaking to the office staff or by e-mail.

We thought this might be useful to parents in trying to decide if their child needs a test.



COVID Home Testing

On Friday Essex County Council wrote to primary schools asking us to support them with a pilot of a new national scheme for home testing of families with children attending school. Essex were asked to pilot this scheme so that the local postal system could be tested over last weekend if possible, prior to the national launch. The DFE have now announced the launch of this scheme nationally.

Households, childcare and support bubbles will now be eligible for twice-weekly home testing. Those individuals will be able to order a box of lateral flow tests to be delivered to their home (or they can collect from a convenient location).

It is important to note that this scheme is not for staff or secondary students who should use the school based kits, or for primary pupils who are still not eligible for testing. The kits are for the remaining household, support or childcare bubble adults.

Children's Well-being

The <u>Essex Wellbeing Service</u> are providing navigators to help schools find the right support for pupils' and their families' emotional wellbeing and mental health needs on the return to education. This is an early intervention offer to provide additional support to education settings on top of what you will already be offering.

The Essex Wellbeing Service has developed a navigator service to both signpost and provide a triage service depending on the needs of our pupils and their families.

The decision to close the school is never taken lightly but there may be rare times when the site is unsafe or insufficient staff can get into the school and closure is unavoidable. Even though school is only open to a small number of children, we may still have to close in adverse weather conditions.


