

Reduce, Reuse, Recycle, Repair

On Friday the children in Class Cuckoo led the whole school zoom assembly by explaining our plastic recycling project. Next week the bins will arrive and then we will check each fortnight how much plastic is being recycled and what sort of items we could reduce the usage of or replace with, a more environmentally friendly alternative.

We also launched our crisp packet recycling scheme. We now have a large black bin by the front entrance to the school to collect empty crisp packets. These are harder to recycle than other items so we are working with the Danbury Community Group as a collection point. The children in Class Cuckoo have designed posters and these will go up next week. We are happy for families to bring their crisp packets to put in the bin before or after school and we will collect any from lunch boxes at lunchtimes.

Our World, Our Future



We are busy collating all the data we collected over the past two weeks about how we travel to school. Next week we will let you know which class has the highest percentage of children and families walking to school and we will compare ourselves to other schools who took part so we can gauge how well we are doing. This will help us think about what more we could do.

As part of this project, we have been reviewing the number of cars now using the Danbury Outdoors car park in the mornings and have decided that the children in classes A, B and C will be safer queueing in the playground whilst they wait for their teachers. **The children still need to follow the staggered start times and stay in their bubbles** and they will go straight into the playground to line up when the gate is opened. We are sorry but at this time, we still cannot invite parents onto the school site at the end of the day. We would remind parents that younger siblings should be kept under close supervision as the waiting area is a car park and there may be vehicular movement at any time.




Well done Poppy and Amber. What an exciting visit!

The 2 Johns


