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Weekly Update

Today is the last day of the first half of the summer term and it has been so good to return to some form of normality in school. The children have coped incredibly well and have settled back quickly into routines and learning. We have been very busy with our *Bounce Back, Back Higher* curriculum not only in focusing on the essential English and Maths skills but on all subjects. Please take some time to look at the wonderful display work below celebrating the huge range of work the children have enjoyed.

I am pleased to inform you that we have appointed a SENCO and Pastoral Manager Mrs Katishe Macey, who will be joining us in September. She will be popping in over the course of the term to enable a smooth handover. She brings with her a wealth of expertise and experience as well as a firm belief in supporting all children in their learning and personal development so that they can be the very best they can. We will also be joined by Mrs Justine Higgins as our new Clerk to the Governing Body. Both are excited to be joining us and I know you will make them welcome.

As we prepare for the next half-term we still have no clear guidance from the government as to how schools will be affected by the possible further lifting of COVID restrictions. Whilst we have put a date in the diary of Monday 19th July for all the children to be involved in sporting activities i.e. Sports Day, we do not know if we will have to continue with class bubbles or if, or how many, visitors we will be able to invite into the school. At this time we feel that we will not be able to proceed with the traditional Open Afternoon so we anticipate that this will be a full school day and end at the usual time.

Danbury Outdoors are now getting busier and we have been asked to remind parents using the carpark that they must <u>NOT</u> park along the roadways in and out of the carpark. Last week a coach could not exit the carpark because parents had obstructed the roadway. This caused delays for the visiting school and reflects badly on our school. Please only park in the car parking area. We are fortunate to be able to use this space but we could lose this privilege if there are ongoing problems.

Topic Work around the School

Last week we changed the displays around the school to reflect and celebrate all the topic work that has been taking place in class since the beginning of term. The children look forward to these lessons which encompass many subjects across the curriculum. Although there may be a focus on history or geography, it also gives us a purpose for English, art and design and technology work. The children are always very proud of their Topic Books and we know that they often follow up this work at home by researching topics more detail and linking them to their Let's Presents.













Last week the children in Class Cuckoo began to gather data on their plastic recycling project.

Hema, Charlotte, Ronny and Harvey joined Mrs Gooding to collect the plastics from all the recycling points around the school. They made a tally of all the different items grouping them together as best they could and then made a summary to display in the corridor. This is what we collected:

Straightaway, we realised that the plastic zip wallets, although not brand new, and the spray bottle could be reused instead of recycled. We felt that there was still some use to be had out of them. We need to check if the cereal bar wrappers from the tuck can be recycled as some had foil backing. We emptied the crisp packet bin in the hall into the main bin at the front of the school and we estimated that it was half full.

After half-term four more children from Class Cuckoo will help Mrs Gooding collect and analyse the plastic we have collected. Each fortnight a different group will work with her so that everyone has a turn.

Over time we hope that we will be able to identify patterns and maybe reduce what we recycle through better choices in the first place.

Safeguarding

The 2 Johns have now confirmed that they will definitely be going ahead with their planned workshops on **Wednesday 9th June** although these will be held remotely. All children, except those in Early Years, will take part in the sessions under the guidance of their class teachers as part of our Computing curriculum. The sessions are tailored to each age group and deal sensitively with the potential dangers and how the children can start to take increasing responsibility for keeping themselves safe.

The parent workshops will look at the online world and how our young people are using it and how they are navigating around restrictions and using the internet often without parents' knowledge. All the sessions are up to date and as such, often change on a monthly basis, if not sooner, to reflect the changing risks faced by children and parents in 2021 both pre and post COVID and take into consideration the increased online activity by our young people and how they have adapted to the online world.

This is something that in the experience of the 2 Johns, many parents are still struggling with. This also includes the children's favourite apps and games. They will look at the dangers the children face not only from predatory people but also how they are being groomed in games. They will explore how all our young people are being influenced online and forming ideologies and views that might be diametric to their parents', which can also give them a skewed view of the world, as well as how influencers work, which can lead our children to conduct dangerous challenges.

The good news is that there will be suggestions for solutions that parents can adopt to help keep their children safe which range from settings on apps to safe use of games and how parents should approach the online arena. The 2 Johns will take the Stranger Danger message that parents are familiar with and make it relevant for 2021.

This week all parents received an invitation and link to join the parent session which will start at 8.00pm after most children are in bed! We hope you will take full advantage of this opportunity funded by the DPSA. Let's work together to keep the children safe!


