# Learning in Class Avocet Summer 2021 South America

We are very happy to see the children in school again for their final term at Danbury Park School. They are now settled back into the routines and are working hard. Our topic this term is 'South America', and we have linked this to the school focus this term of 'Our World, Our Future'. The children have already completed an extended piece of writing about sustainability, with a focus on the issues in South America.

# **Reading Challenge**

The children will be working on their own reading programme with the intention of completing a reading award. They should be encouraged to read a variety of genres and authors, recording in a selection of ways their responses to the books. If possible, we would also encourage them to read aloud to an adult in order to practise fluency and expression and to give them an opportunity to discuss the books they have read.

#### Let's Present

Each Wednesday, the children will give a presentation about themselves. This can include information about their family, interests, holidays, hobbies and clubs. The presentation should last 10 minutes. The children can use Power Point, on line Prezi, models, large posters and artefacts as an aid to your presentation. #### **Curriculum Map**

# **English**

During guided reading, the children will be immersing themselves into a range of texts and answering questions to develop various skills such as author's use of presentation; discussing inference; structural organisation and understanding language and its effects.

In English lessons this term, the children will be studying the book 'Holes' by Louis Sachar. They will begin by finding out about the author, then completing a range of tasks covering a range of genres in response to events within the story. These activities will build on and consolidate what they have learned during the past year. Activities will include building vocabulary, interpreting the text, character analysis and writing in a number of genres such as a diary entry, letter, newspaper











article and story. They will also look into some of the history of North America as well as incorporating some PSHE by discussing the theme of racism within the book.

The children will then have an opportunity to write an extended story. They will look at how stories can be opened in different ways, description and development of characters as well as developing a story line with a clear structure. Within this, they will use a range of writing strategies and techniques together with improving editing skills.
