Weekly Update

It seems that last year and this year have posed yet one challenge after another and no sooner do we make plans than they have to be re-arranged! I am sure that you heard the government announcement on Monday delaying of the lifting of COVID restrictions and that this will have caused some disappointment. This week schools received detailed guidance and regulations regarding end of term events and next week I will be attending a meeting with Clare Kershaw, ECC Director of Education, and Mike Gogarty, Essex Director of Public Health. What we do know is that we have had to rethink our induction programme for the children due to start with us in September (the parents should receive a letter today with detailed information) and also our "meet the new teacher" sessions and plans for Sports Day. Whilst as a school we can be flexible about when the children meet the new teachers, we will need to hold these outside to avoid bubbles mixing and to avoid possible cross-contamination of classrooms. We are now intending to do this on Friday 9th July, weather permitting!

We have taken the decision not to invite parents to Sports Day this year so that we can again be flexible over when and how this takes place as again it is weather dependent and may need to be changed at short notice. We are still charged with keeping the children in discreet bubbles so will need to schedule the events over several days. For the children's sake, we want to ensure that a Sports Day takes place but we only have limited space, time and staff so we need our arrangements to be as flexible as possible.

We have been contacted by some secondary schools regarding their transition arrangements and induction days as they are also having to make changes and they will contact parents directly with details. We are working on two sets of plans for our Year 6 leavers' assembly but we are asking that their parents reserve Wednesday 21st July from 9.30am to 10.30am for this event. We are still hoping to invite a restricted number of family representatives but again this may be weather dependent.

As a country we are moving forward in our battle with the pandemic. In school all staff are working hard to ensure that the children have the best experience we can offer but our paramount aim at this time is to keep pupils, staff and visitors as safe as we can.

Year 6 Visit to Danbury Outdoors

On 26th May, the whole of Class Avocet went on a trip to Danbury Outdoors where we tried out four activities including the zip wire, the aerial trekking, the obstacle course and the biking. There were four groups, one group occupying each activity.







The obstacle course focused on teamwork. One of the activities in the obstacle course was to push one of your teammates up an ungraspable tube to the top of a platform. Then when we reached the top we would have to pull the next person up using a rope. Then we did a competition where we had to use our arms and legs and stayed there until our opponent slipped down the tube. Another one of the excellent activities during the obstacle course was to give one of your teammates a foot up over a wall, then when the last person needed to come up the teammates at the top would pull them up and over the wall.

We also took part in biking. Firstly, we learnt how to change our gears and brakes by going round obstacles made by the instructor. After we were confident and settled with the appropriate size of bike, we ventured of into the woods. Then we followed a series of curved trails of hills before returning back to the main compound where we took of our helmets and prepared for the next activity.

One of the other activities was aerial trekking and some groups decided to do the highest level and conquered some of our personal fears. There were seven obstacles to get past whilst on a harness including some moving logs, ropes to swing across, a net to climb cross, swinging logs to walk across, more ropes to walk across, barrels to climb across and a swing to get back to the tower.

The zip wire was the next activity. You were buckled up at the top of the tower where we stood on a wooden platform whilst being buckled up. Then the instructor let go and we were off. After that, we passed the harness to the next person, who then had their turn. On our third or fourth go we took a ball and when we were above a target we would throw the ball and try and hit the middle of the target.

It ended at 4:30pm and overall was the most fun trip ever. Many people overcame their fears and were no longer afraid of heights.




Total for the Summer Term = £148.50

Please send monies in with your child via the book bags in a named envelope making cheques payable to Danbury Park Primary School. Please note the change of payee as we now have our own bank account and no longer come under the ECC umbrella. This change also means that meals should be paid for in advance and if possible for the whole half-term. You will only pay for those meals that your child has and any credits will be carried forward to the next term. Please note Key Stage 1 and EYFS are entitled to Universal Free School Meals.

COVID-19 Support

Now that the new COVID variant is becoming more prevalent and households are mixing, it is vital that parents are vigilant for signs of COVID and act promptly. Please inform us if your child has suspected COVID or tests positive for COVID-19.

We thought this might be useful to parents in trying to decide if their child needs a test.



Notification and Reminders

Choking Hazards - On Monday members of the teaching staff attended First Aid training and we were asked to remind parents that the number one reason for children choking is them trying to eat whole grapes, tomatoes and olive. We want to encourage healthy eating so just cut them in half which reduces the risk!

Ink Pens – if you have provided your child with a Lamy pen to use in school, please could you ensure that they have sufficient ink cartridges as well. School has a stock of the smaller cartridges which fit the pens sold in the school office but we do have the larger ones for Lamy or Parker pens.




Adventure Island Wrist Bands Vouchers -
