Weekly Update

This week we said goodbye to Mrs Sullivan, who has been one of our Midday Assistants (rising to Senior MDA) for many years. She has ensured that the lunchtimes have run like clockwork during this challenging year of staggered timetables and we are grateful to her that she continued to organise rotas and timetables throughout the periods of lockdown when school was still open for the children of critical key workers. We wish her well as she enjoys more time with her family.

Last week we had two busy days when we were visited by a film crew from Essex County Council to talk to some of our children about the *Our World, Our Future* project. Danbury Park has been identified as a flagship school and we are leading the changes to the primary school curriculum. The interviews will be used by Essex County Council to promote the county's bid to tackle climate change and to show the rest of the country what we are doing. The children were excited and a little in awe of the camera operator, the sound operator and the interviewer but they delivered their explanations confidently and eloquently particularly about the recycling of plastic and the need to protect our wildlife. We were visited the next day by our local MP Mr John Whittingdale and Cllr Peter Schwier to see our solar panels and to find out how our project is progressing.



On Monday there will be a letter going out to all parents explaining how we are planning to re-open in September with a return to our normal ways of operating. Please take time to read this and keep the letter safe as you will need to refer to it at the end of the summer.

Year 6 Visit to Chessington World of Adventures

On Wednesday, Class Avocet went on a school trip to Chessington World of Adventures.

When we arrived we decided which rides to go on. First we went on to Vampire and all the people that didn't want to go on the ride went into a different group, where they went on smaller rides. The teachers said that we were really well behaved whilst lining up to go onto the rides.

After lunch, which we all had together, we queued for Croc Drop, where we plunged 25m into the mouth of a crocodile while spinning round. Some of the others went on Scorpion instead.

Scorpion was a fun rollercoaster where you were sprayed with water and it is one of the oldest rides in the park.

My favourite ride was Dragon's Fury because we went up extremely high and took a sharp turn to the right and the cart started to spin around while travelling at 40mph.

Noah's favourite ride was the Cobra because you spun around really fast and went quite high. He also liked the fact that you weren't strapped in so tightly and you could feel free.

We left Chessington at 5.00pm when it closed and got back on the coach. It took less than 90minutes to get back to school where we could be picked up and taken home by our parents.

Class Dove's Report on our Fundraising Non-Uniform Day for the NHS


On Monday 5th July 2021, the children of Danbury Park School came to school in bright clothes and made a donation towards the Mid and South Essex NHS Foundation Trust. As a school we raised over £400!

We did this in celebration of The National Health Services of the United Kingdom. They have been awarded the George Cross by Her Majesty The Queen. The award comes in recognition of 73 years of dedicated service, including for the courageous efforts of healthcare workers across the country battling the COVID-19 pandemic.

The George Cross - the highest civilian gallantry award, equivalent to the Victoria Cross - has only been bestowed collectively twice before, and today marks the second time it has been awarded collectively by Queen Elizabeth II.



Summer Reading Challenge Saturday 10 July – Tuesday 31 August 2021



Mrs Medcroft joined us recently for a special assembly to tell us all about the Summer Reading Challenge and asked us to pass on this information:

The Wild World Heroes are coming to a library near you this summer!

We're teaming up with World Wildlife Fund for a very special nature-themed challenge that will inspire you to stand up for the planet!

Our Wild World Heroes live in Wilderville, a pretty cool place, but there are lots of things that the Wild World Heroes can do to make their town even better for the people and animals that live there.

The challenge runs from Saturday 10 July to Tuesday 31 August in all Essex libraries and mobile libraries.

Children are being asked to read 6 books to help the Wilderville children make a difference to the environment. As they read library books, they will collect stickers for their folder. After reading 6 books they earn their certificate and medal.

Children can read any library book of their choice; fiction, non-fiction, picture books or books they share with parents and carers – they all count. The under threes are not forgotten with a special version of Wild World Heroes just for them.

The Summer Reading Challenge is delivered by libraries and produced by The Reading Agency. It is open to all children, free of charge.

Safeguarding

This week the children in Year 5 participated in the ECC Road Safety Awareness programme including a walk around the local area. The roads around our school are very busy and in places the paths are narrow so we feel that this is a valuable lesson. Despite the rain, the children enjoyed the sessions and it has made them pay just a bit more attention to potential dangers.

Next year we hope to hold these sessions earlier in the year as we know some of our new Year 5s will be given permission to walk home from school in September.


Midday Assistant Vacancies
