Weekly Update

The non-uniform day on Monday was a great success and thank you to everyone who donated. We raised over £400 for the Mid and South Essex NHS Foundation Trust, which is a great amount. Thank you!

Unfortunately this week we had to close a bubble due to a case of COVID. I think that this proves the virus is very much out there and spreading rapidly. For this reason we have taken the decision to keep all our measures in place until the very end of term. This means that we will still have the staggered start and ends to the school day as well as staggered lunchtimes and we will be preserving our class bubble system. Should we have further cases, we want to minimise the number of children and staff affected. Whilst we have Google Classrooms in place, this is no substitute for face-to-face learning and we want to make the most of every minute of learning time that we have in school. Closing bubbles also puts a strain on our staffing as many members of staff have to isolate and also cannot come to work as they need to be with their own children who may be isolating. We will continue to restrict adults coming into school to essential business only except for parents of children in Year 6 on the last day of term. We aim to hold a socially distanced Leavers' Assembly outside on Wednesday 21st July at 9.30am and we will be inviting one family member to join us.

The guidance from the government regarding September anticipates that schools will no longer have to run class bubbles so that we can return to everyone coming into school and leaving at the same time and also the children can be together in the playground. We will, however, be considering this move in great detail as we need to take into account that for many of our children, they will not have been part of such large groups for a long time. For example, we feel that we will need to re-introduce assemblies starting with smaller groups and build up to whole school events. A detailed letter will be sent out next week with more information.

We wish the best of luck to another valued member of staff, Mrs Rackliff, Class Dove's learning support assistant, who will be leaving us at the end of this term.

This is an exciting week for football and we appreciate that the children will want to stay up late to watch the big match on Sunday. School will be open from 9.00am as usual but if you feel that your children need some extra sleep, then please let them have a lie-in but bring them in by 10.30am. Please note that we have to notify the kitchen of dinner allocation for pupils by 10 am and therefore if your child is arriving after 10am your child will need to bring in a packed lunch.

They have been researching all about palm oil, its uses and about the devastation this can cause to the environment if not sourced responsibly. They wrote to our supermarkets about their concerns and to ask what these large companies are doing to help.

To whomit may concern,

I am a school child learning about the rainforest and my grandparents shop at Sainsburg's. I hope you are aware that I am worned about the palm oil in your products.

Did you know that every 25 seconds an area the SiZl of a football pitch in the rainfored is being cut down and burned to grow palm trees for palm oil? As a result there is a big loss of animal habitats and there are already a big amount of endangered animals in the rainforest. The O rangular for example lives in Indonesia and is critically endangered due to 25 being killed a day.

As well as animals desprestation also has an effect

on humans, as some humans live in or near the rainfact. They lose their homes and lots of carbon diocide and soot open into the air when it is bunt. This is bad with not only carbon diocide going into the air but overgen coming out. And if you are clever enough you will know we need oxeyers. With these trees taken away people plant more palm trees for palm oil.

What I want you to do is reduce your use of palm oil. This may sound hard, us palm oil makes your products have a rice technic. So instead you can use sustainable palm oil, which is palm oil from reused palm trees. These trees were once planted in an area of rainforest cut down and burred. If you need help with this then the Roundlable of Sustainable Folm Oil can (RSPO) can help.

You promised to use 100% sustainable palm oil by 200 but you didn't. I hope you know that Marks and Sperci has! And while you work your way up to having 100% sustainable palm oil, you can also try to be like I celard, who use no palm oil at all.

I hope you had time to agree to use 100% sustaint palm oil. And also stop deforestation as, if it continues the animals and plants living in the rainforest will become extinct and the tropical rainforest bions will no longer be a biome.

Palm oil is a really useful ingredient, but we know that sometimes the way it's made can be harmful, so we have plans to make sure we don't but the rainforests.

We have a Little Helps Plan, that says we have committed to zero not deforestation when buying palm oil, soy, and timber. We aim to do this by sourcing only palm oil certified by the RSPO and we work with a lot of organisations like the WWF to make sure we're doing all we can. In fact, 100% of the palm oil used in our own brand products in the LIK is certified by the RSPO! We've been full members since 2006 and we're working with a lot of groups in the palm oil industry to try to do even more to help the environment.

Last week Mrs Medcroft joined us for a special assembly to tell us all about the Summer Reading Challenge and asked us to pass on this information:

The Wild World Heroes are coming to a library near you this summer!

We're teaming up with World Wildlife Fund for a very special nature-themed challenge that will inspire you to stand up for the planet!

Our Wild World Heroes live in Wilderville, a pretty cool place, but there are lots of things that the Wild World Heroes can do to make their town even better for the people and animals that live there.

The challenge runs from Saturday 10 July to Tuesday 31 August in all Essex libraries and mobile libraries. Children can read any library book of their choice; fiction, non-fiction, picture books or books they share with parents and carers – they all count. The under threes are not forgotten with a special version of Wild World Heroes just for them.

The Summer Reading Challenge is delivered by libraries and produced by The Reading Agency. It is open to all children, free of charge.

COVID UPDATE Message from

Clare Kershaw, ECC Director of Education, and Mike Gogarty, Essex Director of Public Health

Dear Parents and Carers,

The delay to the national roadmap and easing of restrictions has been disappointing for many of us, but it is very important to continue to reduce non-essential mixing until the end of term, whilst the national effort focuses on vaccinating as many people as possible.

The main focus of schools and settings must be the education and wellbeing of their pupils and staff. Schools and settings have worked tirelessly since the beginning of the pandemic to ensure they remain a safe place and can continue to provide education for their pupils and students, whilst reducing the risk of contributing to rising case numbers in the community. There is guidance from the Department for Education, Public Health England and the Local Authority focused on this, which schools and settings must continue to adhere to.

For this reason, some schools and settings have cancelled or significantly amended the arrangements for events such as sports days, leavers' assemblies and proms in line with their individual risk assessments and the protective measures they are able to keep in place. We fully support Headteachers to make these decisions in line with minimising mixing for the rest of term.

We ask that you please familiarise yourself with and adhere to school risk assessments and any event arrangements. If you have any questions or concerns, please speak to your child's school or setting in the first instance.

Midday Assistant Vacancies








COVID-19 Support
