# Welcome Back!

I hope that you all had a good summer break and managed to catch up with family and friends, some of whom you may not have seen for some time. The children came into school yesterday smiling and were pleased to be back with their friends. Some were a little apprehensive when they experienced what are our normal morning routines for them, this was the first time they have come into school through the main gate. With the staff's support and friendly smiles, they quickly found their way to their new classroom and settled into their new class.

We welcomed some of our new Reception children this week and the rest of the cohort will be joining their classmates on Monday. They certainly enjoyed their day playing with the dinosaurs, the water tray and sand, and listening to stories. They were confident, happy and eager to get involved. Well done!

Over the summer we have been busy with plans for this coming year and over the next few weeks we will share these with you. One significant date is that the school year will now end on Thursday 21<sup>st</sup> July 2022 as the Local Authority is giving schools an additional day's holiday in lieu of the extra Bank Holiday in June to commemorate the Queen's Platinum Jubilee. Dates for school activities including class assemblies and parent consultation meetings will follow shortly.

You may have noticed that the grass on the school field is very long and there are some tall weeds appearing. Unfortunately our contractor is experiencing staffing difficulties and the growing conditions have been ideal this summer! We are on the waiting list (along with many other local schools) and the grass should be cut soon and the weeds addressed.

We would like to remind you that we are a nut free school so please check items in packed lunches carefully. We do have children and staff with potentially life-threatening allergies. The children in the infants do not bring any tuck into school as they are provided with free fruit and vegetables from the government. In the juniors tuck should be either fruit or vegetables, with the option of a healthy bar snack on Mondays, but we will be discussing this further once the new school council is elected.

We have lots of plans for this year and are keeping our fingers crossed that these will all be able to go ahead with minimum disruption from COVID. One is the installation of an outdoor gym for the junior children to encourage more physical activity and channel energy. At the moment we are caught up in bureaucracy but if there is any parent or family member who can give me some advice on planning permission, I would be grateful. Please either phone or e-mail the school office. In the next few weeks we will be ready to launch our new online payment system for parents which will make everyone's life smoother! Please look out for a letter with details.

# Morrisons It's Good to Grow

On Monday 6<sup>th</sup> September Morrisons are launching 'It's Good to Grow' initiative and Danbury Park School has registered so that we can collect tokens to exchange for gardening equipment. The programme aims to encourage school children to get outdoors and get growing, helping them to understand where their food comes from and how to grow their own fruit and vegetables, in order to make healthier food choices now and in the future. We do have a school garden and we hope this year to get the children back involved with this activity this year.

To take part, customers just need to have a *My Morrisons* account and every time they swipe when they shop they'll collect **Grow Tokens**.

#### How does this work?

- Between Monday 6th September and Sunday 24th October for every £10 spent in store or online, customers will get 1 Grow Token which they can donate to their chosen school
  - Exclusions apply, including tobacco and fuel sales
- Customers will use their *My Morrisons* app or card when paying to collect their Grow Tokens

   Token cannot be retrospectively added to a customers account
- Customers can select the school they'd like to donate their tokens to within their *My Morrisons* account
- From 1<sup>st</sup> November schools will be able to redeem their Grow Tokens against a wide variety of gardening equipment
- Schools will start receiving their order between the end of January and the end of March.

## Safeguarding

#### We have been asked to pass on this urgent safeguarding alert from Southend Police:

Our online safety experts have been alerted to an extremely dangerous website and app called '**Monkey**', which allows users to have video calls with strangers. The platform markets itself as 'an alternative to *Omegle*, with a *TikTok vibe*'. Our online safety experts reviewed and tested this platform and have found that it contains large amounts of inappropriate, disturbing, and harmful content transmitted via web cameras.

#### What is Monkey?

- Monkey is an online video chat service that is similar to Omegle or Chat Roulette, with a TikTok style interface.
- Users can talk to strangers from all over the world via webcam.
- Once a conversation is finished, or one user wishes to leave the conversation or talk to someone else, they click 'next' and are presented with a new user who could be from anywhere in the world.
- Users are asked to select their gender before meeting people.

#### Age Rating?

- The **website** states that all users must be over 18, but there is zero age verification. Users only have to tick a box to confirm that they are over 18. **Google Play Age Rating**: Parental Guidance.
- The app is currently **only available** on Android devices.

## School Lunches - Costs for Autumn Term 2021

1st Half Term: 2<sup>nd</sup> September – 21<sup>st</sup> October 2021 = 36 days at £2.25 = **£81.00** 2<sup>nd</sup> Half Term: 1<sup>st</sup> November – 17<sup>th</sup> December 2021 = 35 days at £2.25 = **£78.75** Please pay monies for the rest of the term as soon as possible. Thank you.

Please send monies in with your child via the book bags in a named envelope making cheques payable to Danbury Park Primary School. Please note the change of payee as we now have our own bank account and no longer come under the ECC umbrella. This change also means that meals should be paid for in advance and if possible for the whole half-term. You will only pay for those meals that your child has and any credits will be carried forward to the next term. Please note Key Stage 1 and EYFS are entitled to Universal Free School Meals.

# **COVID-19 Support**

Some of the government guidance on COVID has changed over the summer holiday. We will be sending out a detailed leaflet from the NHS and the government which we hope you will find useful. The advice is:

#### What should I do if my child has COVID-19 symptoms?

If your child has any of the main COVID-19 symptoms (a high temperature, a new continuous cough, or a loss or change to sense of smell or taste), they should not attend school and should stay at home.

You should arrange for them to get a PCR test and tell your child's school the test results. Your child should not attend school while you are waiting for test results, even if they are feeling better.

If the test is negative, they should go to school as normal. If they test positive, they should continue to isolate and follow public health advice.

What happens if my child has been in contact with someone with COVID-19 symptoms? If your child has been identified as a close contact, you will be advised that your child takes a PCR test. They should isolate whilst they await the results of the test.

They will not have to continue to self-isolate, unless they have a positive PCR test result.

## **Notification and Reminders**

**Ink Pens** – if you have provided your child with a Lamy pen to use in school, please could you ensure that they have sufficient ink cartridges as well. School has a stock of the smaller cartridges which fit the pens sold in the school office but we do **not** have the larger ones for Lamy or Parker pens.

**Free School Meals** – Due to Covid-19 we understand that your circumstances may have changed or may change in the near future and you may now be eligible for free school meals.
