Weekly Update

Last Friday the children in Class Avocet presented the first of our series of class assemblies to parents. It was great to be able to welcome visitors back into the school and it felt like another step closer to normality. This was the first time in 18 months that the children have had the opportunity to present to an audience and some of them initially described this event as "nerve-racking" and "scary".

The children did a wonderful job of working together in small groups to present some of the work they have done in class over the past five weeks. They supported each other, helped each other out and pulled together as a strong team. Their group articles on leisure activities and how these have changed over the past hundred years were insightful and full of interesting facts and detail. It was also good to see them talk about diversity and respecting differences which is an area they have been exploring in PSHE lessons. It also coincided well with our whole school assemblies this week on Black History Month. The children managed to fit in a song and a dance which added humour and light-heartedness. After the event the children were beaming and so proud of their achievement. Well done!

Today Class Eider are presenting their assembly, and next week it will be the turn of the children in classes Hummingbird and Jay, who are joining together for their very first class assembly.

This week we were pleased to see the return of Reading Partners where all the Year 6 children joined the children in Early Years to share books together. For the teachers this was one of those emotional moments. As adults we realised how the impact of these important bonding and mentoring activities had been lost during the height of the pandemic and we were so pleased to be able to re-introduce them.

Next week is parent consultation meetings. Please be prompt for your appointment, knock on the classroom door at your allotted time and don't be offended when we end the discussion after 10 minutes. We want to be fair to all families and we need to stick to time. You will have the opportunity to look at your child's work either before or after the appointment but we ask that you take a lateral flow test before attending, stay away if you are unwell and that children are left at home. There will also be a survey from governors to find out how you feel your child has settled back at school after the summer break and the disruption of the pandemic.


Class Flamingo's Design and Technology Morning





Last Friday Class Flamingo had a DT morning. This involved lots of different materials, lots of mess but also lots of fun! One of the best things about the morning was having some of our parents into help us with the tricky bits. They were amazing!!

The children had already designed their own aeroplanes (linked to our topic about Amelia Earhart) and discussed how they were going to join their wings and tails. They also looked at different ways they could decorate their own aeroplanes so, all that was left to do was make them!





The children brought in 2L plastic bottles each and some cardboard so they could reuse these items for our models.

Our World, Our Future

Following on from our article last week about Class Cuckoo's *Our World, Our Future* responsibilities, we wanted to remind families who are new to Danbury Park that we have a black bin by the front reception area for the recycling of crisp packets. This type of packaging can't easily be recycled with other plastic items so working with the Danbury Community Group, we offered to be a collection point for the community.

The children are encouraged to put any crisp packets from lunch in the yellow bin in the hall and then the children from Class Cuckoo periodically empty this into the larger bin once we have estimated how much we have collected. We are sorry but we can't recycle any other plastic from packed lunches as these need to be washed first. We ask the children after eating to put all their waste back in their lunch bags so that you can recycle at home. It also helps parents keep track of how much the children are eating.

Families are welcome to bring crisp packets from home and put them straight into the black bin. When it is full we arrange for a collection and then the bin is emptied and everything is recycled correctly.

Morrisons It's Good to Grow Last chance 24th October

Remember to keep collecting the tokens!

How does this work?

- Between Monday 6th September and Sunday 24th October for every £10 spent in store or online, customers will get 1 Grow Token which they can donate to their chosen school
 - Exclusions apply, including tobacco and fuel sales
- Customers will use their My Morrisons app or card when paying to collect their Grow Tokens
 - o Token cannot be retrospectively added to a customer's account
- Customers can select the school they'd like to donate their tokens to within their My Morrisons account
- From 1st November schools will be able to redeem their Grow Tokens against a wide variety of gardening equipment
- Schools will start receiving their order between the end of January and the end of March.

Safeguarding

It is important that you let school know if your child is going home with a different family or adult at the end of the school day. We have a duty to keep your children safe so please do not be offended if, when we cannot find permission for your child to go with someone else, we hold them in school and phone you to check what is happening. A note in the school reading diary for infants is sufficient. For Key Stage 2 children we ask for a separate letter so that it doesn't get missed or a phone call to the office in the morning.

The older children brought home letters about walking home from school on their own and these permission slips are kept on file and shared with the class teachers.

Please also remember to keep the school office informed of any changes, details of new childminders and any changes to contact phone numbers. We are required to have **TWO** contact numbers on file in case of emergencies and for child protection reasons. **Contact forms will be sent home next week for parents to check the information we hold is still correct and current.**

Let's work together to keep the children safe!



COVID-19 Support

The Local Authority has updated their guidance, detailed with the newsletter dated 17th September, showing the latest letter and flow chart to help parents know what to do in the case of your child having COVID or being a close contact.

The main clarification is that if your child is required by Test and Trace to take a PCR test because they have been identified as a close contact of someone with COVID, they can still come to school whilst they await the result.

Please send monies in with your child via the book bags in a named envelope making cheques payable to **Danbury Park Primary School**. Please note the change of payee as we now have our own bank account and no longer come under the ECC umbrella. **This change also means that meals should be paid for in advance and if possible for the whole half-term.** You will only pay for those meals that your child has and any credits will be carried forward to the next term. Please note Key Stage 1 and EYFS are entitled to Universal Free School Meals.

Our new online payment system for parents will be available shortly. Watch this space!

Notification and Reminders

Guitars – Mrs Long would be grateful for donations of any guitars that you may have awaiting a good home. These would be used to enhance our music lessons.

Long hair – Please remember that as part of our school uniform policy children should have their long hair tied back. This helps prevent the spread of head lice which are always a feature of primary school life but is also a health and safety consideration, especially during PE and physical activity.

Coats – The weather will start to turn cooler and it looks as if it will be rainy next week. Please make sure that your child has their coat with them as we will still go out to play even if it is drizzling.
