### Weekly Update





Last Friday the children in Year 5 took part in Road Safety Pedestrian Training with the Safer Essex Road Safety Partnership. The pupils were reminded how they should behave when they are near the road, including how to cross the road in the safest way. They were also reminded why they should always wear a seat belt and the importance of wearing their cycle helmet. Every pupil was given a fluorescent bag to remind them to Be Bright, Be Seen. The children, as ever, were a credit to the school and their families and we received an e-mail complimenting them on their excellent behaviour. At our first full governing body meeting of the year held last weeks governors reviewed their Statement of Behaviour principles. As ever we support every child in being the best that they can be. She can be contacted either on the school gate at the beginning and end of the day or through the school office.

You may have seen the new notices on the adventure play equipment. This is because over the summer the Local Authority revised their Health and Safety guidance for schools and we now need to clearly signpost and regularly remind parents that children cannot use the equipment out of school hours or without school supervision. I am pleased that since re-opening the school at the end of the day, families have followed and respected our expectations, so thank you!

Next week we have individual school photos for the children. If you would like a photo of a pre-school sibling or a family group with a pre-school sibling, the photographer will be available on Wednesday 6<sup>th</sup> October from 8.20am until 8.50am in the school hall. We will take care of all other family groups during the school day.

### Morrisons It's Good to Grow

- From 1<sup>st</sup> November schools will be able to redeem their Grow Tokens against a wide variety of gardening equipment
- Schools will start receiving their order between the end of January and the end of March.

### Safeguarding

It is important that you let school know if your child is going home with a different family or adult at the end of the school day. We have a duty to keep your children safe so please do not be offended if, when we cannot find permission for your child to go with someone else, we hold them in school and phone you to check what is happening. A note in the school reading diary for infants is sufficient. For Key Stage 2 children we ask for a separate letter so that it doesn't get missed or a phone call to the office in the morning.

The older children brought home letters about walking home from school on their own and these permission slips are kept on file and shared with the class teachers.

Please also remember to keep the school office informed of any changes, details of new childminders and any changes to contact phone numbers. We are required to have **TWO** contact numbers on file in case of emergencies and for child protection reasons.

### **COVID-19 Support**

The Local Authority has updated their guidance, detailed with the newsletter dated 17<sup>th</sup> September, showing the latest letter and flow chart to help parents know what to do in the case of your child having COVID or being a close contact.

The main clarification is that if your child is required by Test and Trace to take a PCR test because they have been identified as a close contact of someone with COVID, they can still come to school whilst they await the result.

### **Midday Assistant Vacancies**

We still have vacancies within our Midday Team including for a senior Midday Assistant. If you are interested in working with the children during the lunchtime period, please call into the office for an application form and more details.

### **Notification and Reminders**

**Long hair** – Please remember that as part of our school uniform policy children should have their long hair tied back. This helps prevent the spread of head lice which are always a feature of primary school life but is also a health and safety consideration, especially during PE and physical activity.

**Coats** – The weather will start to turn cooler and it looks as if it will be rainy next week. Please make sure that your child has their coat with them as we will still go out to play even if it is drizzling.

**Toys** – If you are having a tidy up at home now that the children have returned to school, we would be grateful for any donations for our Early Years classes. We are particularly looking for small world play sets with figures, lego, building bricks, toy cars etc. If you are unsure, please check with Miss Bridge, Mrs Crouch and Mrs Smith.

**Ink Pens** – if you have provided your child with a Lamy pen to use in school, please could you ensure that they have sufficient ink cartridges as well. School has a stock of the smaller cartridges which fit the pens sold in the school office but we do **not** have the larger ones for Lamy or Parker pens.
