Each class held their own democratic election for these positions. Candidates had to present a speech to their class mates explaining why they would be the right person for the job and what they hoped to achieve during their year on the council. Mrs Evans (Class Cuckoo's teacher) leads our school council and she will be arranging meetings with the children so that they can discuss and agree on their projects for this year. The school council are important in that they represent the children's opinions and work together on projects, which make a real difference to our school.



## **DPSA Play Equipment**

Last week saw another big step forward with the introduction of play boxes for the children to use at break times. We have class rotas so that there is plenty of space for the children to play and use the equipment and this means during the week the children have the opportunity to use the adventure play equipment on each playground, to share some books in the gazebos, use their play box resources or just play with their friends. Over the next few months we will re-introduce football for Key Stage 2 and expand the use of the play boxes to lunchtimes.

## **Our World, Our Future**

This week some of the children in Class Cuckoo had their first introduction to their class responsibility for the *Our World, Our Future* project. Over the year the children in Class Cuckoo will learn about how plastic is made, where the materials come from and then how difficult it can be to dispose of and the repercussions. The children help monitor the plastic recycling stations that we have around the school so that they can report to the rest of the school on how well we are doing and make suggestions about what more we could do. ## Morrisons It's Good to Grow

Remember to keep collecting the tokens!

#### How does this work?

- Between Monday 6th September and Sunday 24th October for every £10 spent in store or online, customers will get 1 Grow Token which they can donate to their chosen school
  - $\circ$   $\;$  Exclusions apply, including to bacco and fuel sales  $\;$
- Customers will use their *My Morrisons* app or card when paying to collect their Grow Tokens
  Token cannot be retrospectively added to a customer's account
- Customers can select the school they'd like to donate their tokens to within their *My Morrisons* account
- From 1<sup>st</sup> November schools will be able to redeem their Grow Tokens against a wide variety of gardening equipment
- Schools will start receiving their order between the end of January and the end of March.

## Safeguarding

It is important that you let school know if your child is going home with a different family or adult at the end of the school day. We have a duty to keep your children safe so please do not be offended if, when we cannot find permission for your child to go with someone else, we hold them in school and phone you to check what is happening. A note in the school reading diary for infants is sufficient. For Key Stage 2 children we ask for a separate letter so that it doesn't get missed or a phone call to the office in the morning.

The older children brought home letters about walking home from school on their own and these permission slips are kept on file and shared with the class teachers.

Please also remember to keep the school office informed of any changes, details of new childminders and any changes to contact phone numbers. We are required to have **TWO** contact numbers on file in case of emergencies and for child protection reasons.

## School Lunches - Costs for Autumn Term 2021

Please send monies in with your child via the book bags in a named envelope making cheques payable to **Danbury Park Primary School**. Please note the change of payee as we now have our own bank account and no longer come under the ECC umbrella. **This change also means that meals should be paid for in advance and if possible for the whole half-term.** You will only pay for those meals that your child has and any credits will be carried forward to the next term. Please note Key Stage 1 and EYFS are entitled to Universal Free School Meals.

#### **COVID-19 Support**

The Local Authority has updated their guidance, detailed with the newsletter dated 17<sup>th</sup> September, showing the latest letter and flow chart to help parents know what to do in the case of your child having COVID or being a close contact.

The main clarification is that if your child is required by Test and Trace to take a PCR test because they have been identified as a close contact of someone with COVID, they can still come to school whilst they await the result.

## **Notification and Reminders**
