Their biggest concern is the children's safety as there are many low level and sharp branches that could cause serious injury to a child and/or their eyes.

As this is happening at the beginning and end of the school day and the children are in uniform, they are easily identifiable as being a member of our school. We would ask that parents talk to the children and help them respect our neighbours' property.
