#### Weekly Update

I hope that you all had a good half-term break. The children seemed very happy to return to school on Monday and they are looking forward to an exciting half-term ahead.

In assembly on Monday the children found out more about COP26 and the work we have already been doing with Essex County Council and in school to reduce our carbon footprint as part of the **Our World, Our Future** project. Next week is the beginning of Switch-Off fortnight so we will be doing our best to switch off electrical items when not in use. Don't be surprised if the children start switching off lights at home as well as we want to get our message further out to the community! We will take this as an opportunity to introduce the children to their class responsibilities and Class Cuckoo will again collect and analyse the plastic we have collected since September to assess the impact of our actions.

On Monday I will also share with the children a special project that Danbury Outdoors are launching and of which we can play a small part. This involves a plan to use the rain water that gathers locally constructively. More details next week!

Next week on Thursday 11<sup>th</sup> the Year 6 pupils will be walking over to the War Memorial to participate in our annual gathering with St John's School and the Heathcote School. Together we will hold a short service of remembrance and thanks, and the children lay a wreath on behalf of Danbury Park School. Families are welcome to join us at the memorial. In school all the children will take part in two minutes' silence at 11.00am and we will be talking to them about why we do this, which will build on work we cover in our RE and PSHE lessons. Poppies will continue to be taken round to the classes and will be on sale from the office throughout next week.

Our class assemblies are resuming and whilst we want families to join us, we do need to be careful as the COVID infection rate in Chelmsford is high. We ask that places are limited to two per family and that adults take a lateral flow test before coming into school and that if they are at all unwell, they stay away. We also are inviting parents of children in EYFS to join us for *Stay and Play* to find out more about what goes on in lessons and information has been shared directly.

So another busy week ahead!

#### Year 6 Reading Group

Mrs Fleur Medcroft from the Danbury Library has written to thank us for participating in the recent event for the Year 6 pupils and to update us on their adventures. She said:

They were committed to the group, listened well to each other and made thoughtful and creative comments. All eight were truly a pleasure to read with. We read "The Silver Sword" by Ian Serrailier and "A girl called Justice" by Elly Griffiths, both books enabled us to explore concepts of courage and selflessness. It was marvellous to hear the group maturely reflect on what they had learnt; one even commenting on how "Life can turn on a sixpence". They were able to apply the stories to their lives and to reflect on the hardships of others. What a great group.

#### **Governor News**

Mrs Adedotun has a child in the youngest year group so is new to our school and we welcome a fresh set of eyes to the governing body. We hope that she will find this new role both interesting and rewarding.

Sadly Rak Rehal, one of our long standing members of the governing body, has stood down to seek new challenges and to share his expertise with other schools, particularly those in need of a guiding hand. Mr Rehal was chair of the Resources committee and also last year vice-chair of the governing body. He played a very active role in all things financial and to do with the development of our premises. He will be missed and we would like to thank him for his commitment and dedication over the past 10 years. This means that we are looking to fill two co-opted spaces on the governing body, so we are searching for members of our local community who are not parents but with a background in education to complement the skillset we already have. Please complete one survey for each child you have at the school as we appreciate they may have different experiences.

#### Safeguarding

Pupil contact forms were sent home before half-term so that you can check that the information that we hold on file for your child is correct. These needed to be returned by today as it is very important should we need to contact you in an emergency and for safeguarding reasons. Please remember parents must notify the school if your child will be absent from school that day. We ask that you do this as soon as possible and by 9.30am. There is an answerphone option on the school's system to do this.

If we do not know where your child is, we are required to make contact with the family as soon as possible that same day. If we cannot contact parents directly, we will then work our way down the emergency contact list. As part of our Child Protection Policy, if all attempts have failed, we would have to seek advice from Children's Social Care and/or the police.

It also therefore important **if your child is late for school** that an **adult brings them into the school office to sign them in**. The roads around Danbury are often congested and we understand that there will be unavoidable reasons why the children may, on occasions, be late. If you drop them off in the car park to bring themselves into school, there is no certainty that they will arrive safely.

When an adult brings the child into school, you and we know that they are on our premises, that you have officially signed them in and that you are then handing them over to our care for the day.

#### Let's work together to keep the children safe!



#### **COVID-19 Support**

The Local Authority has updated their guidance to Covid 19 in school aged children. A parentmail was sent out on 1<sup>st</sup> November 2021 detailing this information which should help parents and gives advise on what should be done in the case of your child having COVID or being a close contact of someone with Covid 19.

Please send monies in with your child via the book bags in a named envelope making cheques payable to Danbury Park Primary School. Please note the change of payee as we now have our own bank account and no longer come under the ECC umbrella. This change also means that meals should be paid for in advance and if possible for the whole half-term. You will only pay for those meals that your child has and any credits will be carried forward to the next term. Please note Key Stage 1 and EYFS are entitled to Universal Free School Meals.

#### **Notification and Reminders**

**Dogs** – Dogs are not permitted on school premises unless they are a registered support dog for those members of our community with disabilities. They should not be brought into the school entrance area leading down to the playground gate or onto the playground.

**Coats** – The weather will start to turn cooler and it looks as if it will be rainy next week. Please make sure that your child has their coat with them as we will still go out to play even if it is drizzling.

**Free School Meals** – Due to Covid-19 we understand that your circumstances may have changed or may change in the near future and you may now be eligible for free school meals.
