### **Weekly Update**

Well done to the children in Class Goldfinch, who completed our series of class assemblies telling us all about Emilia Earhart and how she was a pioneer in aviation. The children shared with us their art work based on Mondrian and all their learning this term. For these children it was their first class assembly and they were nervous but delivered a confident presentation. All the assemblies this term have been a great way of the children sharing the breadth of work taught in class. They are always engrossed in their topics and they become very knowledgeable. I know this from all the information they share with me whilst I have been supervising dinner times this term. There is always a voice saying, "Mrs Gooding, did you know that...?"

As you will appreciate the COVID situation is changing but we are still planning for the Christmas plays to go ahead. We urge all adults attending to do a lateral flow test before they attend and if they are at all unwell to stay at home. We know that the virus is spreading amongst families and we want to keep everyone as safe as we can so that you can enjoy your Christmas break.
