Weekly Update

Yet again the Autumn Term has closed in not the way we would have hoped. We make our plans with the best of intentions and for the benefit of the children but sometimes matters are out of our control. For some things we must be very grateful and this year we have not had to move to class bubbles or stop the children working and playing with their friends from other classes. There are many positives that we must remember including: class assemblies to which parents were invited, joint Remembrance Day events at the War Memorial with our local schools, Reading Partners, Stay and Play for EYFS, meetings for EYFS parents to help with reading at home, welcoming volunteers back into school and visits from governors, to name but a few.

I would like to pay tribute to the staff at Danbury Park School who have worked so hard this term. It seems that as the pandemic evolves, so the tasks heaped on school become greater. GOVERNOR NEWSLETTER

Autumn Term 2021



Dear Parents/Carers,

Despite the pandemic, it has been a busy start to the new academic year: meetings of all the committees on Zoom, visits by governors to monitor their key stage, class or curriculum responsibilities and the setting of governor targets within the School Improvement Plan 2021/22 and School Development Plan for the next three years. We also began our series of termly surveys, this term focusing on 'settling-in'. This term has also been about 'bouncing back' and 'bouncing higher' for the pupils and Mrs. Gooding and the staff have worked tirelessly to ensure all pupils receive the best possible teaching to aid their progress: we are grateful for all their hard work.

Reports from the chairs of the committees are as follows:-

<u>Curriculum and Pupil Related</u> – Chair, Mrs. Katherine Moulding

- The committee reviewed pupil progress for the academic year 2020-21, noting how challenging this had been for pupils due to the disrupted learning caused by Covid19 restrictions.
- The committee examined the priorities and targets for this academic year for pupils' continued learning recovery in Maths, Writing and Reading and approved Governor Monitoring responsibilities for these areas.
- The committee approved the following policies-Teaching and Learning, Marking, Feedback and Presentation of Work, Assessment, Recording and Reporting, Homework, Behaviour, Anti-bullying, Peer-on-Peer Abuse, Exclusions.

<u>Resources Committee – Chair, Mr. George Fraser</u>

- The Resources committee continues with its plans to overhaul the school outdoor play facilities. Application has been made to the local council for the appropriate permission which, once granted, will allow completion before the end of the academic year.
- The committee (alongside the local parish council) continues to lobby for improvements to the roads immediately outside the school to enhance safety for pupils and staff at the beginning and end of the school day.
- The committee reviewed the recent improvements to the school with regards to 'Carbon net zero' aspirations as well as exploring further improvements that could be made.

Personnel - Chair, Mrs. Debbie Le Monde

- Governors are pleased that all staff vacancies have been filled, confirming the reputation of the school as a good place to work.
- The new SENDCO has made an excellent start reviewing working practices.
- Governors have maintained links with school staff despite COVID restrictions and are reassured that the current provision of staff benefits the children's education.

The Governors wish you all a happy and safe Christmas and New Year.


