Weekly Update

At the end of last week the children in Class Cuckoo collected all the plastic from our re-cycling points around the school and created another data collection sheet. We now have 5 in total so we have enough information for them to start analysing what patterns they can identify and to consider the impact of our actions. We were pleased that this time there were no bubble wrap sheets, soap bottles or plastic single use cups. We hope this means that we are using alternatives to wrap and cups, and re-using the bottles.

On Monday Class Dove were joined by Mr Richard Cecil, a retired teacher, who is working with the Chelmsford Science and Engineering Society and Anglia Ruskin University on a project called *Fresh Air, Fresh Thinking*. I had mentioned at a recent sustainability meeting how concerned some of the children at Danbury Park were about the number of vehicles using Main Road. At first they had identified the constant noise as a nuisance but then talking the problem through, started to consider the emissions and effect on the air quality around our school. So on Monday we were invited to join a special virtual presentation on air quality given by Jessica Muirhead who is a Principal Air Quality Consultant.

As Class Dove's focus for *Our World, Our Future* is our carbon footprint and the promotion of walking to school, they represented our school. The presentation was perfectly aimed at the children so that they could understand what pollutants are, how they affect air quality and the targets countries have set to reduce them. As part of the project we will be loaned equipment including a weather station connected to a Raspberry Pi with the ability to collect and measure pollutants and also the wind and rain, which could have an effect on our data. Mr Cecil is setting up the equipment for us and then the children in Class Dove will start gathering data for us to analyse and share not only with other schools in the group but also with the project group and eventually the wider community. We will share more information with you in due course.

Today you will receive a letter inviting parents to make an appointment just before the half-term break to meet with class teachers to discuss your child's progress and we are pleased that we feel these can take place face-toface which also enables you to look at all their work since September. We think you will be amazed by the sheer quantity and more importantly their progress.

Please remember school starts at 9.00am so children need to be in and have time to get ready to start learning by then. The gate will be locked promptly at 9.00am

Parent Surveys

In November the governors conducted one of their regular surveys to find out how parents and carers felt their children had settled back into school. Below are the results.

Analysis of results (based on number of replies to each question):

- 100% of parents agree that their children have settled in happily at school this term
- 97% of parents agree that they are confident their children are safe and well cared for while at school
- 94% of parents agree that any issues they raised were dealt with well (presume no issues raised for 7)
- 100% of parents agree that staff are approachable and helpful
- 97% agree they have been informed of the topic being learned this term
- Numbers participating at 39 is lower than hoped for.

Similarly we conducted a survey in school with the children to gather their perspective.

How well do you think you have settled in your new class?

Responses were overwhelming positive with average scores being 4 (5 being the highest) or above. Teachers, LSAs and friends were an overwhelmingly positive influence and helped pupils settle in. Negatives were very few.

How happy are you in your new class?

Responses were overwhelming positive with average scores typically 4 or above. Teachers, LSAs and friends were again a positive influence as well as the curriculum and topics. Many responses across the school said the children were happy with everything and there were no negatives. Any negatives related mostly to areas of the curriculum being challenging or not personally liked by the children.

Have you enjoyed your learning this term?

Responses were high 4s. In most classes pupils said there was nothing that they didn't like and topic work was a firm favourite. For every curriculum area that pupils said they enjoyed, other pupils said they had not.

How could we improve your class?

Many children said there was nothing that could be improved. Suggestions varied and covered predominantly more time for favourite curriculum areas as well as improving break and lunchtimes with football and more equipment. Resources for the classroom were mentioned including more books and new laptops.

We use these surveys to inform our school improvement plan so that we can make Danbury Park School the best it can possibly be.
