#### **Weekly Update**

I hope that you all had an enjoyable and restful Easter holiday. The children certainly seemed keen to be back at school on Tuesday and they are looking forward to the term ahead.

Today we have all been marking World Earth Day and this has seen the relaunch of our *Our World, Our Future* initiative. Each class has their own area of responsibility and although some classes have already started on their projects such as Class Cuckoo with their plastic re-cycling and Classes Jay and Hummingbird understanding why we re-cycle paper and how we have to take care of our equipment, many classes will be focusing on this aspect throughout the summer term.

Thank you to everyone who donated seeds, plants, shrubs and trees. We have lots of plans to get our vegetable garden planted and to brighten up the outside areas around the school including creating a special sensory garden to also encourage insect life. This will also act as a quiet reflective area for children at break and lunchtimes who may be seeking a quieter space. I am setting each class a challenge of creating a class hanging basket and these will be displayed outside each classroom so that we can watch their progress as they grow and flourish under their care. We want to know which will be the most successful and why.

Next week sees the start of the installation of the outdoor gym which has been long awaited. This will be behind the PE and DPSA sheds so we would remind parents that pre-school and younger children must be kept under close supervision at the end of the school day.

We have an exciting term planned including celebrations to mark the Queen's Platinum Jubilee, an Arts Week as well as Sports Day and a return of Danbury Park's Got Talent. Dates are included at the end of the newsletter and more details will follow near the time. Topic letters from each class will follow next week so that you know what is happening and how you can support your child with their learning but if you have any questions the staff are always happy to help.

# **Tuck Shop Returns**

We as a school are delighted to announce that the tuck shop will be re-opening after the Easter Holidays. Some children from Year five and Year six will be chosen to run the stall daily. As we are a nut free school we will not allow any products containing nuts. On the other hand, the school will be rewarded with a treat day on Friday allowing them to bring in cake and healthy treats.

Please do not bring in any crisps, chocolates and sweets as they contain too much sugar. Various fruits will be sold and vegetables along with cereal bars for the children to enjoy. The system will work with the children coming into the hall in the morning to buy their fruit and go back to their classrooms. The cost of the fruit and vegetables on sale will be 20p.

We are pleased that the DPSA and Mrs Backshall, Class Budgerigar's LSA, have offered to help us run the tuck shop. We need a few days after Easter to get the fruit, vegetables and cereal bars in stock so we plan to open fully on **Monday 25<sup>th</sup> April**.

Please support the children in their endeavours to promote a balanced diet and healthy life-styles and choices. The children in the infants all receive free fruit and vegetables so unless school is aware of a medical need, they do not bring in any tuck. In the juniors we want to move away from the salty snacks, chocolate bars and sweets that have started to creep in since the pandemic started. These are not good nutritionally and although may be eaten as treats, we ask that these are saved for after-school or weekends.

# **Well-being**

At Danbury Park School the well-being of our pupils and staff has always been high priority. In September we started a project to refurbish the DT room and turn it into a calm and quiet oasis. We are pleased that the transformation is now complete and the room is being fully used to help anyone in need.

We have a soothing picture of a tropical beach with gentle waves to transport us somewhere where we can feel calm and relaxed. On the walls we have displays about the Zones of Regulation to help children articulate their emotions as well as ideas for mindfulness and de-stressing. One of our pupils is also working on a display about the *Hidden Chimp* which he has found very useful as a strategy for understanding feelings and reactions and wants to share with others.

The room is used by counselling services who work with individual children and also by our team of well-being mentors (Mrs Koch, Mrs Backshall and Mrs Babbs). Their work is invaluable in helping children through difficult times in their lives and helps the children see that school is a safe and supportive place where we can listen to their worries and be there for them.





# **COVID Guidance from 1st April**

The government has issued the following guidance:

The population now has much stronger protection against COVID-19 than at any other point in the pandemic. This means we can begin to manage the virus like other respiratory infections, thanks to the success of the vaccination programme and access to antivirals, alongside natural immunity and increased scientific and public understanding about how to manage risk.

Unless we receive information from the Local Authority to the contrary the following procedures will apply:

- Children and young people who are unwell and have a high temperature should stay at home and avoid contact with other people. They can go back to school, college or childcare when they no longer have a high temperature, and they are well enough to attend.
- Adults with the symptoms of a respiratory infection, and who have a high temperature or feel unwell, should try to stay at home and avoid contact with other people until they feel well enough to resume normal activities and they no longer have a high temperature.
- Adults with a positive COVID-19 test result should try to stay at home and avoid contact with other people for 5 days, which is when they are most infectious. For children and young people aged 18 and under, the advice will be 3 days.

# **Safeguarding**

Now that the weather is improving and you may be considering letting your older children walk to and from school on their own, it would be a good time to remind them about road safety. Main Road and the roads around the village do get very busy in the mornings and at the end of the school day. We are working with the Parish Council and the local community to improve safety in the village but this will take some time. A gentle refresher in road safety for the children from families would go a long way!

Last week and this week school participated in the annual *Sustrans Big Walk and Wheel* event which inspires pupils, staff and parents to be amazing and take active journeys to school. This would also improve the air quality around the school! Class Dove will be collating the data we have gathered across the school and will report back on their findings next term.

Let's work together to keep the children safe!

#### **Midday Assistant and Staffing Vacancies**

We still urgently require Midday Assistants to help us at lunchtimes starting after the Easter break. This is a rewarding and busy job helping the children enjoy their school dinners and playtimes.

We can be flexible on days so please contact the school office for more details.

#### **Notification and Reminders**

**Ink Pen Purchases** - As we have moved to becoming a cashless school, the purchase of ink pens now needs to be made via Pay360 and not the school office. You will need to order the pen via the stationery tab on Pay360.

Once we have seen a payment of £1.50 on Pay360 the school office will deliver the pen to the child's classroom.

Pay 360 – Thank you to all the parents who have now joined the new online payments system. Our office staff are happy to support you if you are experiencing difficulties. Please note that we are now well on our way to being a cashless school as part of *Our World, Our Future* project. By having the online system, staff need to make fewer journeys by car to the bank, thus reducing emissions and we are using less paper.
