Weekly News



This week saw the installation of the outdoor gym equipment and I hope you will agree that it looks great. The grass will eventually grow through the matting so that the area blends in well with our surroundings. The next stage is to allow the equipment to settle into place, to install a fence so that the area is separated from the field and lay matting from the playground as a pathway with a gate from the playground. Every class will then be introduced to using each station correctly and safely before we then include it as part of break and lunchtimes rotas. We know the children are eager to get started and the junior children were fascinated watching the contractors work. We are so grateful to the DPSA for their contribution towards this project.

Already the summer term is well underway and we are getting ready for the statutory testing time in primary schools. Miss Johnston and Mrs Buer held a meeting for Year 2 parents on Monday to reassure them that the KS1 SATs are just a small part of our assessment process and that the tests are conducted in a supportive and positive way. These will take place over the course of the month of May. This week the children in Class Flamingo were selected by the DfE to take part in the trialling of tests that are being developed for use in future years. The test administrator was very complimentary about the children and they were keen to give their feedback on the style and the presentation of questions.

The week starting 9th May the Year 6 children will sit their tests and then as we move into June, Year 1 pupils sit the Phonics Screening and Year 4 the Multiplication Test. As ever preparation for these events is built into our teaching each week so that when the children come to the tests, they are familiar with what is being asked of them so that they can do their best. If you have any worries, please speak with your child's class teacher.

Earth Day at Danbury Park

Class Eider

Class E had a fun-packed Earth Day 2022! They came in dressed in non-school uniform with all the colours of the Earth. Many children donated plants, seeds and bulbs for us to grow at school.

Initially, the children planted broad beans in transparent plastic cups so that once the beans start germinating, we can see what is happening to the bean. They will have to be watered regularly so watch this space!



Then, Class E put their acting shoes on and prepared and performed a presentation to the whole class about a specific biome on the planet: desert, tundra, taiga, rainforest, deciduous forest and savanna. Some groups created bright and colourful posters whereas others wrote playscripts. All in all, they were very informative and entertaining to watch.





Finally, we learned a 'Reduce, Reuse and Recycle' song and talked about how important it is to reduce the amount of plastic packaging we buy and how to reuse things such as clothing. Class E had a go at reusing and recycling materials brought from home to design and make musical instruments.

The KS2 Tuck Shop has been a huge success and we are very pleased with the number of children buying their fruit each morning. We are finding out from the children what other fruit and vegetables they would like us to stock so that we can widen the variety on offer.

Please support the children in their endeavours to promote a balanced diet and healthy life-styles and choices. The children in the infants all receive free fruit and vegetables so unless school is aware of a medical need, they do not bring in any tuck. In the juniors we want to move away from the salty snacks, chocolate bars and sweets that have started to creep in since the pandemic started. These are not good nutritionally and although may be eaten as treats, we ask that these are saved for after-school or weekends.

Safeguarding

Now that the weather is improving and you may be considering letting your older children walk to and from school on their own, it would be a good time to remind them about road safety. Main Road and the roads around the village do get very busy in the mornings and at the end of the school day. We are working with the Parish Council and the local community to improve safety in the village but this will take some time. A gentle refresher in road safety for the children from families would go a long way!

Notification and Reminders

Ink Pen Purchases - As we have moved to becoming a cashless school, the purchase of ink pens now needs to be made via Pay360 and not the school office. You will need to order the pen via the stationery tab on Pay360.

Once we have seen a payment of £1.50 on Pay360 the school office will deliver the pen to the child's classroom.

Pay 360 – Thank you to all the parents who have now joined the new online payments system. Our office staff are happy to support you if you are experiencing difficulties. Please note that we are now well on our way to being a cashless school as part of *Our World, Our Future* project. By having the online system, staff need to make fewer journeys by car to the bank, thus reducing emissions and we are using less paper.

COVID Guidance from 1st April

The government has issued the following guidance:

- Children and young people who are unwell and have a high temperature should stay at home and avoid contact with other people. They can go back to school, college or childcare when they no longer have a high temperature, and they are well enough to attend.
- Adults with the symptoms of a respiratory infection, and who have a high temperature or feel unwell, should try to stay at home and avoid contact with other people until they feel well enough to resume normal activities and they no longer have a high temperature.
- Adults with a positive COVID-19 test result should try to stay at home and avoid contact with other people for 5 days, which is when they are most infectious. For children and young people aged 18 and under, the advice will be 3 days.
