We are working on a school Travel Plan, and with the Parish Council and the City Council to get a supervisor to help with families crossing the road but these things do take time.

## Year 5

The children in Year 5 have had a busy start to the term with a special theatre performance about the environment which linked well with our whole school topic of ***Our World, Our Future*** and also some training to keep them safe on the roads as they become more independent. Below are some reports from the children.

### Abbie Ayre and the Shed of Science

On the 22<sup>nd</sup> September, all of Year 5 came together to watch a theatre show which taught us about air pollution. The show used the characters Charlie, Abbie and Dr Ayre (who was Abbie's gran). There was also a computer called Derek 5000.

We discovered that cars cause more air pollution than planes and factories. They explained to us that there are twenty-five million cars in the whole of the UK, and we can all help by walking to school instead of driving. You will also get to school earlier if you walk instead of driving. You need to walk so you get a lot of exercise so you will be very healthy. Also you need to be careful with your little children because the car pollution starts from the bottom up.

It was a great show and we all enjoyed joining in with a song at the end!

## Tuck

We are in the process of reviewing with the children on the School Council the tuck arrangements for break times in KS2. For many years now the children in KS2 have followed on from what happens in the infants with the free fruit and vegetables and they are only supposed to bring in a piece of fruit or vegetables from Mondays through to Thursday. We also have the tuck shop that runs every day. On Fridays we invite the children to bring in a treat in the form of crackers or a cereal bar. We do not allow crisps or chocolate and sweets and **nothing containing NUTS** in any form.



## 2022 Harvest Collection

This harvest we are again pleased to be able to support local people by collecting tinned and dried food for the Chelmsford foodbank. The foodbank provides short term emergency food to people in crisis. Food is given as an intervention strategy which allows care professionals, such as Housing Support Officers, CAB advisers, Social Services, doctors etc, time to put longer term measures in place. At the foodbank centre people also have access to information about other services and support organisations. All food given out by the foodbank is donated by generous members of the public. ## Safeguarding

At Danbury Park School we take e-safety seriously. At the beginning of every school year, as part of our computing curriculum, our pupils are taught about E-safety. This is then re-visited every term to reinforce the message of personal safety. The elements of computing are embedded across all subjects in the curriculum and our pupils regularly use the internet as part of their learning. In school, we use a filtering system to prevent children accessing inappropriate sites.

Over the past years we have also organised parent information workshops to help families keep abreast of the new technology with the aim of helping keep the children safe at home.

Our top tips are:

-  Set up your computer in a shared area at home so that you can see the sites your children are accessing;
-  Set your security levels so that you can limit access to sites and time spent on electronic devices;
-  Talk to your child about what they are doing online;
-  Talk to your child about keeping their personal information private.

## Notification and Reminders

**Pay 360** – Thank you to all the parents who have now joined the new online payments system. Our office staff are happy to support you if you are experiencing difficulties. Please note that we are now well on our way to being a cashless school as part of *Our World, Our Future* project. By having the online system, staff need to make fewer journeys by car to the bank, thus reducing emissions and we are using less paper.

**Ink Pens** – We have now moved away from using fountain pens in the classroom and are using Berol Writing Pens. These will be provided by the school. However if you are happy to supply your child with a good quality ink pen with blue cartridges, then they will be allowed to continue using them. Please note that biros and gel pens are not allowed and if a child needs a different type of pen because of a specific problem, then we will provide them.

**Free School Meals** – Due to Covid-19 we understand that your circumstances may have changed or may change in the near future and you may now be eligible for free school meals. ### **Entitlement and what is required**

The Government set the criteria for free school meal entitlement. To be entitled, you need to receive: Universal Credit with an annual income of £7,400 or less

- Income Support
- Income Based Job Seekers Allowance
- Income Related Employment & Support Allowance
- Pension Guarantee Credit
- Child Tax Credit (But not working tax credit) with an annual income of less than £16,190
- Parents with Asylum Seeker status who receive support under Part VI of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
- Working Tax Credit 'Run-on' – the payment someone may receive for a further 4 weeks after they stop qualifying for Working Tax Credit
