# Our World, Our Future Thoughts from our Year 6 Pupils

A few weeks ago the Year 6 pupils worked with me to write an article for a magazine showcasing how our children are getting involved in saving energy. Here are their thoughts:

### Solar panels

We have sets of solar panels at Danbury Park above Class Goldfinch, Class Hummingbird and Class Jay (Classes J and H are connected). Altogether on one roof we have 142 and on roof two there are 72. The solar panels operate by absorbing the sun's energy and converting into an energy source. Did you know that on a hot and sunny day the solar panels create enough energy to power the whole school, but on a cold day with no sun they can produce barely any energy?

### Why we try

We try and save electricity so that we can spend less money and try and help the environment. Power plants use nuclear reactors and fossil fuels that send bad gases into the atmosphere, breaking it and making our planet hotter and hotter every year melting the icebergs, releasing fresh water to salt water, and changing the weather creating hurricanes and flooding. We use solar panels because fossil fuels are running low and create global warming. Solar energy is renewable.

### Plans for the Future

Danbury Park School is working with the local village energy group as we would like to be able to store and share any surplus electricity generated by the solar panels for the benefit of our whole local community. We would also like to replace all our lighting in school with more environmentally friendly alternatives so that we are saving electricity and reducing our carbon footprint further. We are investigating the best way to do this.

Although we are working closely with our local schools, we want to share what we are doing across the country and make links with schools in other countries so that we can share ideas and learn from each other.

## Safeguarding

The primary school (Reception) admission round opened on **Monday 7 November 2022**, for parents of children to apply for a Reception school place for the academic year that starts in September 2023. The statutory national closing date for applications is **15 January 2023**.

The Government set the criteria for free school meal entitlement. To be entitled, you need to receive: Universal Credit with an annual income of £7,400 or less

- Income Support
- Income Based Job Seekers Allowance
- Income Related Employment & Support Allowance
- Pension Guarantee Credit
- Child Tax Credit (But not working tax credit) with an annual income of less than £16,190
- Parents with Asylum Seeker status who receive support under Part VI of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
- Working Tax Credit 'Run-on' the payment someone may receive for a further 4 weeks after they stop qualifying for Working Tax Credit
